The apostle Paul wrote that there are many gifts but the same Spirit, different ministries but the same Lord.

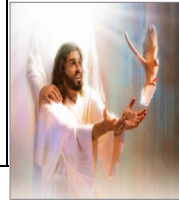

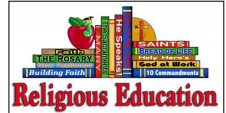

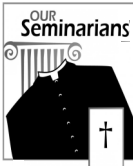


OLV Ministry Position
