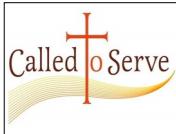


Permanent Diaconate Program

1st Reading: Genesis 18:1—10a

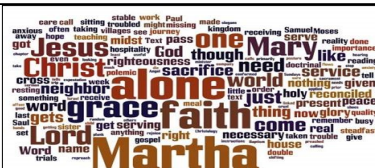
The Lord appeared to Abraham in the form of three visitors. Abraham invited them to his home, and he and Sarah prepared them a generous meal.

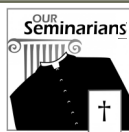

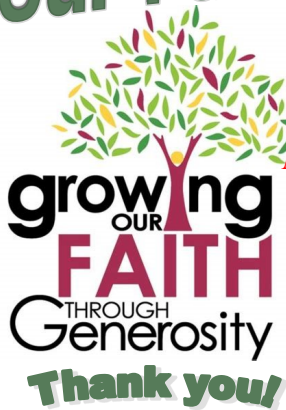
