



The celebration of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is one of the oldest feasts in Christendom. In the Eastern Churches the feast is known as the Feast of the Dormition of Mary. Taken literally, dormition means "the falling asleep." Interestingly, it is said there is an apocryphal document from the fourth century called, "The Falling Asleep of the Holy Mother of God" recounting the death, laying in the tomb, and assumption of Mary. It is believed to be composed in the words of the Apostle John, who stood at the foot of the cross with Mary and to whom Christ entrusted his mother. What is truth and what is legend is not clear. Both feasts affirm that Marv was taken body and soul to heaven; however, Roman Catholics believe she did not die first.
