Eucharist Reminders

At mass NO ONE is obliged, (except the priest), to receive Holy Communion. Also NO ONE is obliged to take both species under the appearance of bread or under the appearance of wine. You may if they are both offered, but receiving only one or the other is to receive the fullness of Jesus Christ... Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity... even if it is under the appearance of bread alone or wine alone. That said, you might be mindful of receiving from the chalice if you are feeling ill or if you still have some lingering symptoms from a prior illness. While what you are receiving is Jesus Christ (and NOT wine... only the appearance thereof), the Church still encourages prudence for all when utilizing a common chalice. Again, NO ONE is obliged to receive from the chalice if you have any concerns about its common use. Let us joyfully remember how the Lord gives us Himself in communion and ultimately all faithfully practicing Catholics in attendance are welcome to receive Jesus Christ in communion however it is offered both under the appearance of bread and of wine.

If you decide to pass on the Precious Blood, please remember to bow as you walk by.

As cold and flu (and now Covid) season approaches here are some prudent reminders about mass. If you are ill or caring for one who is ill, the obligation to attend Sunday mass (or another day of Obligation) is automatically dispensed. You do NOT NEED and probably should NOT COME and risk yourself in a weakened condition or expose others to illness. You are technically SHUT IN for that time and are completely dispensed. Get well as quickly as you can! We look forward to seeing you back when you recover.

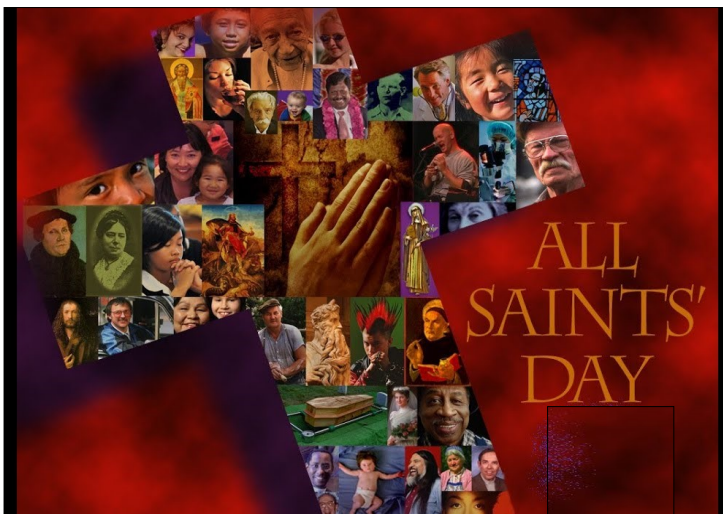
