# **Updates**

As we enter the new Church year and the start of the Advent season, there will be a few updates coming for Our Lady of the Valley. I do not think that they are necessarily extreme in any manner, but they are necessary nevertheless. For many years parish volunteers have made the bread used at most masses. For all those who are and have been involved, this has been a tremendous effort and a generous gift from every person who has participated. To all who have volunteered in this ministry, your offerings of love and talent in baking is deeply appreciated and the parish offers you all its gratitude. The Church is clear on the quality and manner that our Eucharistic bread is prepared, remembering that every visible crumb is Jesus Christ Himself. Thus, Bishop Vetter has strongly indicated that he desires all parishes in the Diocese utilize bread made "out of house" just as our wine is made "out of house." This is in order to achieve a higher quality and consistency throughout the Diocese in the substance of bread that is to become the Lord.


For centuries in the Church, these altar breads have been carefully prepared by religious sisters to support their lives of prayer and service in their important vocations. The Bishop has also requested that we obtain our bread from a religious community if at all possible. The Benedictine Sisters of Clyde, MO have already been providing us with our low-gluten altar breads and hosts for the sick. They are always asking for ongoing support to continue their hidden life, so we will begin to obtain all of our altar breads from them. This will help them and will achieve the requested consistency concerning this matter. Practically, the bread will look a little different, but remember it is still most importantly Jesus Christ who gives us the greatest gift of Himself in the Eucharist.

Secondly, in 2011 "The General Instruction of the Roman Missal" was updated. Herein it was indicated that precious metal is now required to hold any bread or wine that has been consecrated at mass into the Body and Blood of Christ. The time for this update has arrived and we have obtained silver pewter vessels that will replace certain glassware that has been previously used to hold the Body of Blood of Christ. This entire liturgical set has been generously donated by a gift from the Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus in Helena. The parish offers its gratitude for the Knights generosity in helping the parish implement this update without incurring any additional cost for OLV.

Finally, as a specific request from Pope Francis, the Bishop has expressed that we purposefully engage in a little more silent time surrounding the Eucharistic liturgy. Across the Diocese of Helena, weekend masses will begin with a few purposeful extra moments of prayerful silence. Before the silence, a Diocesan prayer from St. Anselm will be prayed to ask God for blessing over the next few years as we engage "A Campaign for Life in the Diocese of Helena." This will slightly alter the manner in which mass will start, but the gathered community will be led by a lector each time to help avoid confusion.

I certainly recognize that change can be quite challenging as we move forward into the future. Many of us have wonderful fond memories of the recent years, and modification may bring a little grief and sadness. Sometimes it is easy to just stick to the past. But the Second Vatican Council reminds us that the Church is always moving forward, and so from age to age the updates that change brings are inevitable. But our eternal God is changeless, and we remember that as we worship Our Creator and Redeemer, we are led forward by the promise of the Holy Spirit into a future directed toward Jesus Christ. Please know of my deepest appreciation for your patience, your cheerfulness, your joyful worship, your tireless service, and generosity as we pass into this new season of faith. May God provide you and yours with many beautiful Advent blessings.


