High School Youth Stand Up and Speak Out Against Big Tobacco

Oklahoma teens participate in a National Day of Action to educate their communities about tobacco products and the tobacco industry.

OKLAHOMA, April 6, 2023 - High school youth throughout Oklahoma working on the CounterAct Tobacco campaign hosted events at Youth Action For Health Leadership (YAHL) partner schools and organizations for Take Down Tobacco Day. Youth-led events were held on or near March 31st at school sporting events. YAHL youth members encouraged individuals attending these events to complete a CounterAct Tobacco survey and play a can toss game where they could earn prizes.

<u>Take Down Tobacco Day</u> is a youth-led initiative established by the <u>Campaign for Tobacco Free Kids</u>. This National Day of Action is designed to bring communities together and advocate for a tobacco-free future. YAHL partner schools have participated in Take Down Tobacco Day for two straight years, and it has become a great opportunity for youth members to get involved, support a nationwide event and speak out against Big Tobacco.

Despite recent progress to reduce tobacco use, tobacco is still the number one cause of preventable death, killing half a million Americans and more than eight million people worldwide every year. According to the <u>2022 National Youth Tobacco Survey</u>, over 2.5 million kids in the U.S. were current ecigarette users and 85% of them used flavored products.

Participation in Take Down Tobacco Day ensures our youth's voices are heard, empowering them to educate their communities. As we work towards a tobacco-free generation, it is important for youth to lead the conversations and speak out against Big Tobacco.
