From Your (Outgoing) President

Dear Hadassah Friends,

It's hard for me to believe that two years have passed and my presidency is drawing to a close. We have had our ups and downs in these years, but the one constant has been your commitment to Hadassah and our mission. I am so grateful to my boards from last year and this year for being so willing to work hard to make our plans succeed and for being so capable. You have made my job easy.

We have been working organizationally to bring our mid-flung region a little closer. In March, we joined our Toledo, Ohio chapter for a docent-led tour at the Toledo Museum of Art, and in June, we had a wine and cheese get-together with our Lansing chapter and decided to plan one event annually.

As usual, we had many excellent programs this year, and we tried some new and different experiences. Our 4-part Shtisel series started the year off, as we learned a bit more about the Chassidic lifestyle. The Israeli Art in a Bite Workshop brought two talented Israeli artists, Carmel Bar and Michal Evyatar, to us, and we went on a journey to explore the connection between art and food. We created our own masterpieces using food.

We have reinitiated our doll project to resounding success, with upwards of 25 women participating, some bringing their granddaughters! In February, our Tikvah, Roosevelt, and Aviv chapters worked together to present a terrific heart health event at Henry Ford Hospital. In March, we participated in our "first in a while" Midwest Conference in Chicago, with thought-provoking panels and speakers. We had a chance to meet our Hadassah sisters from the Chicago-North Shore and Great Plains regions.

On the philanthropy front, this year, our Judi Schram Annual Meeting was an evening event with a silent auction and a meet and greet with our speaker, Tara Schuster, for sponsors and our Keepers of the Gate, as a thank you to those incredibly special annual donors. In May, in honor of Israel's 75th anniversary, we also had a major fundraiser in the beautiful garden of Joan and Bob Epstein. Money raised from our "Garden of Healing" event purchased a pediatric patient room.

In addition to our Israeli Art in a Bite Workshop, as part of our Israel programming, we partnered with Temple Shir Shalom to host Gil Hoffman, a former journalist with the Jerusalem Post and CEO of HonestReporting.

Our chapters, as well, continued their tradition of both engaging programming and community service projects. And this year, they came together to plan both the heart health event and our combined installation in December.

Tragically, this year, on October 7th, we witnessed the most horrific terror attack in Israel in 50 years, as Hamas tore through the defense wall and brutally murdered communities bordering Gaza, young people at a concert, and IDF soldiers in their barracks. As I write this, Israel is now at war, and all our efforts are aimed at ensuring that Ein

Peace, Politics, and Plutonium with Gil Hoffman

An Insider's Look at the Internal and External Challenges Facing Israel and How They Can Be Overcome

n October 23rd, Hadassah Greater Detroit partnered with Temple Shir Shalom for a timely program featuring noted journalist and Executive Director of the non-profit HonestReporting, Gil Hoffman. Gil's organization monitors the news for bias, inaccuracy, and other breaches of journalistic standards, particularly in reporting about Israel. He spoke about how we can make a difference on social media and about the importance of Hadassah's Gandel Rehabilitation Center. After the horrific events of October 7th, in addition to the many tragic murders, over 6,000 Israelis were wounded. Those wounded will need continuous rehabilitation care, some for decades, and our center will be there to serve them. Over 200 attendees had the chance to ask questions and then enjoyed a dessert reception.

At War

Heal Israel Now

Dear Hadassah Friends,

Heartbroken. Horrified. Shell-shocked. Sad. And hopeful, because of Hadassah.

These are just some of the feelings that so many of us have felt these past weeks as we have watched, read, and heard the news of the devastating and horrific Hamas attacks in Israel and the ensuing war.

It is at times like this that we who support Hadassah are reminded that Hadassah's hospitals are critical for the health and safety of our brothers and sisters in Israel. Hadassah Medical Organization (HMO), Jerusalem's only Level-1 Trauma Center and one of only six such centers in all of Israel, is being depended on to treat many of those who have been seriously injured and will undoubtedly be called on to treat many more.

Even before the war, the need for more services was acute, but now it is vital. Rehabilitation is a way of "redefining hope," said Dr. Tamar Elram, director of Hadassah Hospital Mount Scopus, which will soon complete its new Gandel Rehabilitation Center, significantly increasing the number of patients the hospital can treat.

"After a man or a woman is unfortunately wounded, whether in a car accident or from disease or in a terrorist attack like we're experiencing today, they might not necessarily go back to the life they knew before," said Dr. Elram during Hadassah's live briefing about Hadassah's war-response efforts on November 2. "But then our object is to redefine what hope is for them; what is their new way of health and living?"

The Hadassah Medical Organization is currently home to the only rehabilitation center in Jerusalem.

The cost for the seriously injured can tally in the tens to hundreds of thousands of dollars. Emergency donors are needed to help offset these unexpected costs.


