Aaron Landsman is a theater artist, performer and teacher. His work includes site-specific productions in the kinds of places where people perform their lives: homes, offices, buses and meeting rooms, as well as more traditionally staged works. Aaron is a 2017-18 Guggenheim Fellow in Theater, a former Arts Fellow and current Visiting Lecturer at Princeton, and the 2013-15 Gammage resident artist at ASU Gammage. His recent projects have been presented in New York at Abrons Art Center, The Chocolate Factory Theater, and HERE Art Center. From 2012-14 his participatory theater work City Council Meeting, created with Mallory Catlett and Jim Findlay, was presented in Houston, Tempe, New York, San Francisco and Keene, NH, with funds from NPN, NEFA's National Theater Project, MAP, Jerome and LMCC. He is currently in year two of a 20-year art and activism project about gentrification called Perfect City, which is funded by LMCC, the Rubin Foundation, Graham Foundation, Abrons Arts Center, and 200+ Kickstarter donors. His 2008 work Open House was commissioned by The Foundry Theatre and presented in 24 NYC homes, and has since been remounted in Serbia, Norway, Arizona and Morocco. His earlier work was presented at PS122, Dixon Place, Movement Research, DiverseWorks (Houston), and Fusebox (Austin). He has taught at Juilliard, NYU, and Bard, and guest lectured at many schools. He co-created and continues to teach professional development workshops through the Creative Capital Foundation. As an actor Aaron performed with Elevator Repair Service for many years, and has also appeared with Richard Maxwell, Tory Vazquez, Johanna S. Meyer, Julia Jarcho and Andea Kleine. His writing is published or forthcoming in Theater, The Village Voice, Painted Bride Quarterly and other journals.

Clarinda Mac Low started out working in dance and molecular biology and now creates participatory installations and events that investigate social constructs and corporeal experience, with a recent concentration on climate change. She is also Executive Director of Culture Push, an experimental organization that links artistic practice, social justice, and civic engagement, a co-founder of Works on Water, an organization that supports artists working with water as site and material, and a medical journalist specializing in HIV/AIDS. Grants and honors include a BAX Award in 2004, a Foundation for Contemporary Arts grant, 2007 and a 2010 Franklin Furnace Fund for Performance Art grant. Mac Low holds a BA, double major in Dance and Molecular Biology, from Wesleyan University and an MFA in Digital and Interdisciplinary Arts Practice from CCNY-CUNY. She currently teaches at NYU (ITP) and at CCNY-CUNY. clarindamaclow.com

Johanna S. Meyer is a choreographer/performer/educator. She has created over 21 pieces. Her last show *piece.piece* (2015) was performed at the Gibney Dance Center. Over the years, she has collaborated with: Nami Yamamoto, Alexandra Hartmann, Maja Rajenovich, Ahalya Satkunaratnam, and Siri og Snelle. Meyer has worked for theater directors: Andrea Stover, Juliana Francis, Ken Nintzel, Tory Vazquez, Rich Maxwell, Robert Cucuzza, DJ Mendel, and Talking Band. Meyer is making an evening-length show for February 2019.

Jesse Koehler is a Brooklyn based actor, playwright, and collaborator. He has an undergrad degree from Sarah Lawrence College where he mainly worked on devised and ensemble based productions. He has also been lucky enough to study abroad with BADA, The Moscow Art Theatre School, and La MaMa Umbria. In the past year he has worked with/at Immediate Medium, Rat Queen Theatre Company, Fresh Ground Pepper Company, The Collapsable Hole, and Dixon Place. Recent credits include working as the assistant director on Immediate Medium's workshop production of *Billy The Bomber* by MarySue Price, George Tesman in *Hedda Gabler* at the Dyckman Farmhouse, and sneaking his physical movement clown work into his friend's monthly backyard dance show.

Ogemdi Ude is a Harlem based Nigerian-American choreographer, director, community organizer, and performer. Her work is interdisciplinary, intertwining movement, sound, and visual art to investigate themes of blackness, culture, and memory. Her practice is grounded in her academic work in Afrofuturism and black performance theory. This extends to exploring performance as a liberatory and healing practice for black communities. She has worked and trained in Berlin, Vienna, and Melbourne and with choreographers including Maria Scaroni, Thomas DeFrantz, Melanie Lane, and Prue Lang and directors Lear deBessonet and Laurie Woolery. Her most recent work includes: *Hiatus*, commissioned by Elizabeth Streb's SLAM Emerging Artist Commissioning Program and pace, commissioned by Princeton University. She also serves as Community Coordinator for the Public Works initiative at the Public Theater. She graduated Magna Cum Laude with a BA in English, Theater, and Dance from Princeton University in 2016.

Uros Mladenovic is an actor and youth worker. He finished the Academy of Arts in Novi Sad in the class of professor Ljuboslava Majera in 2013, and master studied with Professor Haris Pašović in 2014. He enrolls doctoral studies in dramatic and audiovisual arts in 2015. Since 2018, a certified youth worker has passed a university course "Leadership and Development Youth Work" under the Jönköping University (Sweden) program, implemented by the Center for Youth Work, Novi Sad. Since 2014 he has been working with young people and has been leading the youth theater in Paracin. The following year he founded the Teleport Theater, which deals with youth artistic education, and plays plays for young people in various cities in Serbia. In 2017, he became a member of the Association of Kulturans in Novi Sad, where he works as an artistic director. He is currently a coordinator or participant in four regional theater projects involving youth work. He also participated in European art projects as a member of the Kulturanova: art interventions, feelms for creativity. Since 2017, he has also conducted a youth theater scene in Cuprija and works with young people every three weeks in three different cities. As an actor, plays at the Serbian National Theater, Bitef Theater, Cultural center of Paracin, Academy of Arts Novi Sad, as well as in independent productions. He starred two roles in the film, and two in television series. Laureat Prize for Little Prince for outstanding results in the field of drama art, awards for acting at the festival of new theatrical forms, as well as awards for best direction at the festival of youth theaters. His hobby is orienteering, he likes to travel and play social games.

Jelena Galovic was born and raised in Novi Sad, second biggest city in Serbia. When she was little she would spend her free time in theatre watching rehearsals with her grandmother who was a leading lady of Serbian Nation Theatre in Novi Sad. Jelena fell in love with the magic that is theatre and everything about it. But as a teenager she was insecure and lacked courage to stand on stage and give her all. After high school she went trough little soul searching and decided to try for the Academy of arts to avoid looking back in life and regretting not even trying. Maybe she didn't believe in her self at that time but others saw her and all she had to bring to the stage. Since than she has worked in the theatre mostly and little in film and gone trough many daily jobs to support herself while pursuing her dream. Lately she's trying to get more socially involved because basic human right are being broken everyday in her city and the country and it's pissing her off badly!

Višnja Obradović has graduated acting from Academy of Arts in Novi Sad. Through the years she has been performing on the stages of Serbian National Theater Novi Sad, Youth Theater in Novi Sad, The National Theater Sombor, etc. Currently she is a memeber of ensemble of Serbian National Theatre in Novi Sad.where she perform numerous roles. (Zozefina, The walking ghost D. Dukovski, dir. A. Popovski; Lotika, The bridge on the Drina, I. Andric, dir. K. Mladenovic; Anatomy lesson D. Kish, dir. A. Urban; Open house Aaron Landsman, dir. V. Obradovic/A. Landsman; Nana, Leave a message, V. Ognjenovic, dir. V. Ognjenovic; Rozaura, The servent of two masters K. Goldoni, dir. B. Lijesevic, Maria Vasnjecova, Heart of a dog, M. Bulgakov, dir. R. Milenkovic and more then twenty more performances) She is also known for some movies (Golden league, Apofenija, More then a Game) an TV serias (Mixed marriage, Jagodici) etc. She won several awards during the studies and Special award for acting in the movie Golden league in Cinemacity festival in Novi Sad.

Modesto Flako Jimenez is a Dominican-born, Bushwick-raised theater maker, producer, and educator. HOLA Best Ensemble Award Winner for 2015. ATI Best Actor Award Winner for 2016. HOLA Outstanding Solo Performer for 2017, NY Times and Wall Street Journal profiled. Flako is best known for original productions and three signature festivals – Ghetto Hors D'Oeuvres, One Catches Light, and Oye! Avant Garde Night! – produced with his company Oye Group. Flako has appeared on TEDxBushwick, Early Shaker Spirituals (Wooster Group), Last Night At The Palladium (Bushwick Starr/3LD), Yoleros (Bushwick Starr/IATI theater), Conversations Pt.1: How To Make It Black In America (JACK). Take Me Home (3LD/ Incubator Arts Project), Richard Maxwell's Samara (Soho Rep.), Kaneza Schaal's Jack &. (BAM/On The Boards). Modesto received the 2016 Princess Grace Award Honorarium in Theater. In 2018 he became the first Dominican-American Lead Artist in The Public Theater Under The Radar Festival with his show Oye For My Dear Brooklyn.

Association Kulturanova is a non-governmental, non-profit organisation founded for popularisation and affirmation of art and cultural spirit. It was founded in May 2001 in Novi Sad (the capital of Vojvodina, region in Serbia). Organization was founded as "umbrella" association of various non-formal independent art groups and individuals, young artists from Novi Sad. Organization' focus is on development of urban youth culture and raising awareness on relevant social issues, with the vision of building creative platforms for youth in Novi Sad and in region.

- 2. lectures, conferences (human rights, youth policy)
- 3. workshops, seminars (education)

Kulturanova is very much concerned how art can effect environment and how can it benefit to local communities. Through our activities we are promoting cultural diversity and cultural tolerance and we see cultural rights as important part of human rights. We are doing most of our projects in partnership with many organisations from the region as well as from EU and doing this we are promoting fight against xenophobia and encouraging collaboration among different cultures.
