Please let us know on Seesaw if your child struggled with the task.

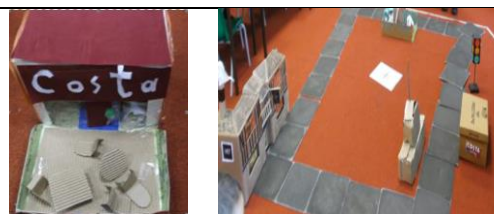
All homework is based on the current week's learning so please complete the homework tasks relevant to that week as we will have just taught it.

	<p>Look at this week's vocabulary posters on Seesaw. Can you record/video yourself acting out these words, explaining the meaning of the words and/or using this week's words in a sentence? Could you even write an interesting sentence with this week's words in it?</p>	<p>Shuffle the number cards, make sure the numbers are hidden and then choose a number card. Say the number and make that amount with the pasta pieces. Can you now find one more than that amount? What do you have to do to get 1 more? Collect the extra piece of pasta and count to find the new total. Record your original number and the number that is one more in your homework book. For example, if you pick the number 9, you would write the following in your book...</p> <p>1 more than 9 is 10.</p> <p>Upload a photo of your work to Seesaw and you can even upload a photo of you playing the game!</p> <p>Ext: To use number cards up to 20 rather than just 10.
