Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to the second half of the Spring term. We hope that you have all had a restful week and have managed to stay safe during storm Eunice. As you may have noticed, our playground domes were not so fortunate!

Over the next two weeks in English, we will be writing character and setting descriptions as well as a book review based on our focus book 'The Worst Witch' by Jill Murphy. As you may be aware, Thursday 3rd March is World Book Day. Our theme in year 4 is 'Witches and Wizards' however please do not feel obliged to purchase a costume purely based on the chosen theme. We would love to see the children dressed up in costumes they may have at home or that they can create easily.

In Maths, we consolidated our topic of 'Multiplication and Division'. We continued to discuss the different mathematical vocabulary that relates to the topic and have been continuing to use the formal column method and bus stop method to solve calculations including exchanging and remainders.

In Science, the children started a new topic 'Animals including Humans' and learnt about the different types of teeth and what their jobs are. They will also be able to tell you some fun facts they have learnt. In Geography this week, the children used atlases to locate where the Roman Invasion took place. This is linked with our new history topic on the Romans.

This term in DT, the children will be designing and making a Roman sandal. This week they used the computers to research different Roman Sandals.

If you have any questions or queries, please do not he sitate to send us a message on Seesaw or come and speak to us following the dismissal of the children at the end of the day.




This week, we have looked at the different types of teeth that humans have. Your homework is to compare the teeth of different animals. Your task is to answer the questions about animals' teeth.
