

Dear Parents/Carers,

We cannot believe that we are writing the final newsletter of the Spring term! As we approach the end of term, we would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your continued support and encouragement. The year 4 team have been reflecting on the fantastic progress that the children have made and the fun times we have had this half term.

The children did so well in their class assemblies. That saying, 'It will be alright on the Night' was certainly true in this instance. Additionally, year 4 have been frequent winners of the attendance award that Miss Oliver presents every Friday to the class with the highest attendance in the school. Without you ensuring that your children are in school every day and on time, this would not have been possible, thank you! Also, you may recall before Christmas that the children wrote stories based on the book 'The Queen's Handbag' that were entered into a short story competition organised by the Royal Mint Museum in association with the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Well... just recently we received very exciting news that Abigail De Los Rios (4SI) was selected as 'highly commended' with her story 'The Queen's Dalmatian's Solid Gold Collar'. Her story was chosen as a result of stages sitting from nearly 550 stories from all across the UK. The judging panel met and decided the winner of the competition. Abigail's story was one of the final ten, so it really did do very well indeed. She has therefore won a Platinum Jubilee commemorative coin and her story will be published as part of the museum's winners' gallery.

Finally, we appreciate that homework is not usually given during the holidays, however since we will be starting our new English topic on Biographies after Easter, we have given the children a sheet (as below) that they will need to complete based on a member of their family. Roman Day

In year 4 this week:
