To avoid disrupting your child's education, you should arrange (as far as possible), appointments and outings:

- · after school hours
- at weekends
- · during school holidays

By law, all children of school age (aged four to sixteen) must receive a suitable full-time education.

Once your child is registered at a school, you are legally responsible for making sure they go regularly.

Reminder!

The school day on W/D starts at 8.50am – children may enter the classroom from 8.40am. On R/Ave the school day starts at 9am.

Any child that arrives between 9–9.15am on W/D and 9.10– 9.25am on R/Ave will receive a late mark (L). If your child arrives after these times they will marked as late after the register closes.



We have ongoing issues with parents parking on zig-zag lines and performing dangerous manoeuvres near the school sites. 




We are regularly reminding parents about parking sensibly.
