#### Times Tables

Each week we will be focusing on a times table of the week for you to learn. As well as the weekly spelling test, you will also have a times table one featuring the times table of the week. ### Reading

Children are to learn the orange list <u>and</u> either the purple <u>or</u> the green list of spellings. These will be tested in class every Friday. If your child is finding it challenging to learn 10 words, then please focus on the 5 words from the purple. There will be a mixture of year 4 statutory words, topic words or spellings which follow a particular rule or pattern. Children are encouraged to use the look, cover, write, check method to learn lists.
