Practical Ways to Continue to Bring Relief

By sending funds in the following amounts, you will allow one of READ's ministry partners in Ukraine to help someone in need.

\$30 for a Warm Blanket - to make a pallet, use it as a barrier against the cold over a window or doorway, or layer with outerwear for extra warmth.

\$75 for a Tank of Gasoline - for transporting supplies & IDPs, going to work, and picking up medications.

\$100 worth of Food - help feed a family of 4-6 people for a week.

\$100 for an Electric Space Heater - for use in the city or apartments that can't burn wood to heat a room.

\$250 for a Cord of Firewood - Ukrainians living in rural homes will burn 7 to 8 cords of wood through the winter.

\$1000 Gasoline Generator for a Church - Electricity is needed for appliances, where service to IDPs continues, for lights & heat, food prep, and washing bedding and clothing, for example.

Winter HAS come. The cold and the challenges it brings will last through the month of March. There are 7 million internally displaced people in Ukraine. That is one-in-three people - primarily women, children, and the elderly. Energy sources for heating (natural gas & electricity) have been weaponized. These resources are in short supply and come at much higher costs for heating traditional Ukrainian homes and the churches and ministries that continue to help the IDPs.

Our partners know the challenges coming and have shared specific requests:

- Fuel to run generators
- * Money for food organizations provide less and less each month
- Furnace
- Firewood
- Gas stove
- * Kettles, regular and electric
- Phone charging stations
- * Satellite Internet system
- Blankets
- Sleeping bags
