This months book read is a bit of a difficult one as it is a rape case, and very befitting of the title, *He Said, She Said* by Erin Kelly.

The book does not dwell too much on the actual rape itself, but develops more into the story of what happens after.

The rape happens at a Festival in 1999 when there was a total eclipse of the sun.

A young couple come across
the rape victim almost immediately after the attack. The story
then develops, over the next 15 years and many more total/
partial eclipses of the sun, into the relationship between the
victim and the couple who found her.






