6 MONTHS BEFORE

FIND A RELOCATION CONSULTANT
You can always handle the entire relocation process by yourself; however, working with a relocation consultant can reduce your
chances of making mistakes. Remember, you're moving to a different country with a different culture, tax regime, currency, and
cost of living. It would be wise to consult a relocation expert.
VISIT IMMIGRATION OFFICIALS
Visit the Immigration offices to understand what you need to complete the move. You can inquire about more information on
vaccines or quarantine.
OBTAIN OR RENEW YOUR PASSPORT
Typically, most visa offices will request applicants to submit their passports during the application process. Apply or renew your
passport before you begin your visa application.
APPLY FOR VISAS OR WORK PERMITS
The U.S. has one of the world's most powerful passports, granting holders visa-free access to 185 countries. You can travel to most
countries in South America, Europe, and the Caribbean without a visa.
However, countries like India, China, Indonesia, Vietnam, Russia, and many others require visas for American passport holders.
Also, you'll need to specify the purpose of your trip. Are you relocating to work, study, or on business?

3 MONTHS BEFORE

GET FREE QUOTES FROM INTERNATIONAL MOVERS
Transporting your belongings to a different country is going to be hectic and stressful. Ideally, you should consult international
movers and get free quotes. Don't just go with the price; also, look at the services they offer.
GATHER ALL YOUR NECESSARY DOCUMENTS
You need to compile the following documents; visa, passport, school records, work permit, social security cards, medical
records, marriage certificate, pet vaccination records, drivers' license, and more.
CONTACT THE EMBASSY
The embassy of the country you're relocating to can offer all the information you need about your travel and stay.
LOOK INTO HEALTH INSURANCE OPTIONS
When choosing insurance, keep in mind that international health insurance is different from travel insurance. Don't choose the
latter and hope to get the benefits of the former. International health insurance is moving to another country for an extended period.
THINK ABOUT YOUR FINANCES
You'll need to pay for travel, accommodation, food, quarantine, international moving services, and other expenses. If you're a
student, the government or institution offering the scholarship might pay for some of the services, but you'll still need to think
about finances.

1 MONTH BEFORE

TAKE ALL NECESSARY VACCINES Most countries will require proof of certain inoculations and medical tests before allowing entry. Check the CDC website for more information on vaccines and tests needed when traveling to various countries. You can also contact the foreign embassy of the country you're relocating to or transiting through to get their current entry requirements
BOOK INTERNATIONAL MOVING COMPANY Since you have quotes from several international moving companies, select one that offers all the services you want at an affordable price.
LOOK FOR STORAGE OPTIONS FOR MOVING Ask whether the moving company will offer moving boxes; if not, you can buy online. Also, consider selling some of your belongings to reduce the moving costs. You can get household items in whichever country you go to at affordable prices Additionally, consider leasing storage units to hold your belongings. This will come in handy, especially if you're selling your home
CONTACT THE BANKS TO OPEN NEW ACCOUNT Ask if your bank has a branch wherever you're going. If not, consider opening another account with a different bank with branches in your new country. If there are none, consider alternative money transfer services such as PayPal, Venmo, Skrill, or Wise.
FIND THE FURNITURE RENTALS How long do you intend to stay in your new country? If it's a few months to a year, consider furniture rentals. However, if it's more than two years, consider buying new furniture.

1 DAY BEFORE

VERIFY ALL DETAILS WITH YOUR MOVERS If you're shipping your belongings with international movers, be sure to confirm all the details about the shipment. How long will it take? Where do you collect your shipment? How do you contact the movers in case of anything?
PREPARE ALL THE RELATED DOCUMENTS Prepare all the documents you need to travel from travel itinerary, tickets, vaccination records, proof of medical tests, visa, passport, and cash.
PURCHASE TRAVEL GUIDES You can never go wrong with a travel guide. If possible, talk to people living in your new country to understand the cost of living, move abroad, and acclimate to the new culture
REFILL & PICK UP PRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS Contact your family doctor, get your medical records, and refill your current medications. Be sure to confirm with the embassy of your destination whether you can carry medication. For example, medical marijuana is legal in the U.S. but illegal in most countries.
