II. Examples From Old Testament—Judgment Begins At The House Of God

- **A.** Ezekiel 9:1–11
 - 1. First, mark those who grieve (v. 3–4)
 - **2.** Then kill—beginning at the sanctuary (v. 5–6)
 - **3.** God's assessment of Israel (v. 8–10)
 - 4. "Marker" reports back (v. 11)
- **B.** Ezekiel 22:23–29
 - 1. Every section guilty; but primarily the spiritual ones
 - **a.** Prophets (v. 25, 28)
 - **b.** Priests (v. 26)
 - **c.** Princes (v. 27)
 - **d.** People (v. 29)
 - 2. Motivation: Covetousness; the love of money (e.g., Balaam)
- C. Sins of Sodom (Ezek. 16:49)—produce homosexuality—compare USA today
 - 1. Pride
 - 2. Fullness of food
 - **3.** Abundance of idleness
 - **4.** Failure to care for the poor

III. Application To USA

- **A.** "Are you willing to ask Me to give you My heart for America?"—Jesus
- **B.** A man among them . . . (Ezek. 22:30–31)
- C. Is the U.S. church "salt that has lost its savor?" (Matt. 5:13) "Having a form of godliness . . . ?" (2 Tim. 3:5)
- **D.** Three possibilities: (1 Cor. 11:27–32)
 - 1. Judge ourselves . . . and repent
 - **2.** Be chastened by God . . . and repent (compare Heb. 12:5–11)
 - **3.** Reject God's chastening . . . and be condemned with the world
- **E.** ... Not grieved for the affliction of Joseph (Amos 6:1–6)
