# Delivered From This Present Evil Age 4143

### I. Introduction

- **A.** Wisdom: Seeing things from God's perspective
  - 1. The sun does not revolve around the earth
  - 2. God does not revolve around man or exist for him
- **B.** World vs. age
  - 1. Age Greek: eon time
    2. World Greek: cosmos space

### II. Age—Galatians 1:3-4

- **A.** Hebrews 1:1–2
  - 1. Jesus, the heir of all things
  - **2.** Through Jesus God made the ages
  - **3.** Jesus is the brightness of God's glory
  - 4. Jesus is the express image of God
  - 5. Jesus upholds all things by the word of God's power
  - **6.** Jesus purged our sins
  - 7. Jesus sat at God's right hand
- **B.** Theory of relativity
  - 1. You cannot specify space without time or time without space.
  - 2. "Worlds" connotes space and "ages" connotes time.
- **C.** Hebrews 11:3
  - 1. The ages were brought into being by something that is not visible: the Word of God.
  - 2. What cannot be seen is the ultimate reality (2 Cor. 4:18)
- **D.** Ages are made up of generations (Eph. 3:21)
- **E.** Ages of ages: forever and forever:
  - 1. "I am alive for the 'ages of the ages'" (Rev. 1:18)
  - **2.** Sevenfold doxology (giving glory to God) (Rev. 7:12)
  - **3.** Jesus will reign (Rev. 11:15)
  - 4. Torment of Babylon (Rev. 19:3)

- 5. Torment of the devil, antichrist, etc. (Rev. 20:10)
- **6.** Believers will reign (Rev. 22:5)
- **F.** Jesus came at the *consummation* of the ages (Heb. 9:26)

Cosmic applications for His coming

**G.** The ends of the ages have come on us (1 Cor. 10:11)

All God's eternal purposes focus on us

- **H.** The present age is coming to an end
  - **1.** Matt. 13:39–40, 49
  - **2.** Matt. 24:3
  - **3.** Matt. 28:19–20
- **I.** Jesus' name is supreme in this age and the next (Eph. 1:20–21)

Nothing is going to change the place of Jesus

- **J.** Satan is the god of this age (2 Cor. 4:3–4)
- **K.** The present age is evil (Gal. 1:4)
  - 1. We have been delivered from this present evil age
  - **2.** We belong to the next age
- L. We taste the powers of the next age through the Holy Spirit (Heb. 6:4–5)
- **M.** The present age: (Matt 13:22)
  - 1. Causes worries
  - 2. Makes believers unfruitful
- N. Do not be conformed to the present age (Rom. 12:2)
  - 1. Primarily in your thinking
  - 2. Self-centered vs. God-centered
- **O.** A faithful servant *cannot* love this present age (2 Tim. 4:9–10)

### III. Diagnosis (Phil. 3:17–21)

- A. Do not set your mind on earthly things
- **B.** Do not be an enemy of the cross of Christ
- C. The cross is the line of separation (Gal. 2:20)

# The World That Satan Rules 4144

## I. The World: Cosmos

- **A.** Definition: A social world order which is temporary (1 Pet. 2:5, 3:6)
- **B.** Satan has become the ruler of this world
  - 1. John 12:31, 16:11
  - 2. "He [Satan] has nothing in Me" (John 14:30)
- C. Satan controls through deception
  - 1. Satan has the whole world in his grasp (1 John 5:19)
  - 2. Satan deceives the *whole world* (Rev. 12:9)
- **D.** Satan rules over all rebels
  - 1. All of us are children of God's wrath because of our rebel nature (Eph. 2:1–3)
  - 2. A picture of Satan: "He is king over all the children of pride" (Job 41:34)
- **E.** Satan claims control of the governments of the world (Luke 4:5–7)
  - 1. The devil is a liar

- 2. The world was "betrayed" to Satan by Adam
- **F.** God loves the world and gave Jesus to die for it (John 3:16)

Despite all that is bad, God loves the world

- G. Cross: God's judgment on Satan and the world
  - 1. The cross terminated Satan's claims (John 12:31–32)
  - 2. The cross: the *just judgment* of God upon the world and our carnal nature
  - **3.** "The ruler of this world is judged" (John 16:11)
- H. The cross resulted in Satan's defeat
  - 1. Total, eternal, irreversible defeat
  - 2. The law was nailed to the cross (Col. 2:13–15)
  - **3.** How the cross accomplished Satan's defeat: It made provision for the past and the future
    - **a.** God can only bless the righteous
    - **b.** We must achieve righteousness to qualify
    - **c.** You *cannot* achieve righteousness by keeping a set of rules (Rom. 10:4)
    - **d.** Through the cross God made provision and forgave *all* sin
    - e. The law stood between God and us
    - **f.** Jesus removed the law as a requirement for achieving righteousness with God
    - **g.** We still stumble but our *faith* is reckoned to us as righteousness
- **I.** The world does not recognize Jesus or His disciples
  - 1. The world did not know Him (John 1:10)
  - 2. The world does not know us because it did not know Him (1 John 3:1)
- J. The world hates Jesus and His disciples
  - **1.** John 15:18–19
  - **2.** John 17:14
  - **3.** Humanism is "the world"—they *hate* us
- **K.** The Spirit of God and the world are opposed (1 Cor. 2:12–13)
  - 1. The spirit of this world keeps Christians from the Spirit of God
  - **2.** Any attempt to categorize man that leaves out the reality of the spirit distorts the truth. Man is *spirit*, soul and body.
- L. The Spirit of God in believers is greater than the spirit of the world
  - 1. We cannot afford to meet the world on its terms
  - 2. Be graceful, tactful, humble—but do not bow to this world

# The Line Of Separation 4145

## I. The World—Recap

- A. A social world order in rebellion against God
- **B.** Through man's fall Satan has become the ruler of this world
- C. Satan controls the world through deception
- **D.** Satan rules over all rebels (even Charismatics!)
- E. Satan claims to control the governments of this world
- **F.** God loves the world and gave Jesus to die for it

### II. The World—Continued

- **M.** Believers are the light of the world (Matt. 5:14)
  - 1. Education is *not* light: God and His people are the *only* source
  - **2.** The well-educated can be totally in the dark
  - 3. We only shine as we hold forth the light of the Word (Phil. 2:15)
- N. Believers represent Jesus in this world
  - 1. You are the only Bible somebody may ever read
  - 2. "As He is, so are we in this world" (1 John 4:17)
- **O.** Believers *must* proclaim the Gospel to the whole world (Matt. 24:14)
  - 1. Make disciples, not church members
  - 2. Signs will follow. . . . They don't follow because we don't go
- **P.** Believers *must* use but not abuse the world (1 Cor. 7:31)
  - Don't let the world grab you
- Q. Believers must not be contaminated by the world (James 1:26–27)
  - 1. Bridle your tongue or your religion is useless
  - 2. Visit orphans and widows (James 4:17)
  - 3. Keep oneself unspotted from the world
- **R.** Friendship with the world is *enmity* with God
  - 1. Be friendly with your neighbor but not the system (James 4:4)
  - **2.** 1 John 2:15
- **S.** Believers must *expect* tribulation in the world (John 16:33)
  - Erroneous to believe if you have tribulation you are out of God's will
- **T.** Believers are victorious over the world through faith (1 John 5:4–5)—you don't overcome something unless it opposes you
- U. The world is corrupt through lust (2 Peter 1:3–4)
  - 1. Lust: Perverted desires
  - **2.** Lust takes 3 forms: (1 John 2:15–17)
    - **a.** The lust of the flesh
    - **b.** The lust of the eyes
    - **c.** The pride of life—desire to exalt self
  - **3.** Eve experienced all 3 forms of lust (Gen. 3:6)
  - 4. The essence of sin is the desire to be independent of God
  - 5. Jesus' temptation focused on all 3 forms of lust (Luke 4)
    - a. Bread: lust of the flesh
    - **b.** Kingdoms of the world: lust of the eyes
    - **c.** Cast yourself down/perform a miracle: the pride of life—All religious error enters by pride
  - **6.** Corruption is irreversible (2 Tim. 3:1–5,13)
  - 7. Regeneration is needed (Matt. 19:28)

- V. Present world is impermanent (1 John 2:17)
- **W.** God is establishing a kingdom *not* of this world (John 18:36)

## **III. Remedy**

- **A.** The cross and *no other* 
  - 1. Those who are Christ's *have* crucified the flesh with its passions and desires (Gal. 5:24; Rom. 6:6)
  - 2. Personalize Gal. 2:20: "I am crucified"
    - **a.** Deny *your* self
    - **b.** Pick up *your* cross
  - **3.** The world has no claim this side of the cross (Gal. 6:14)
