No wrong answer...anything that brings up their history or uses we talked about in the videos.

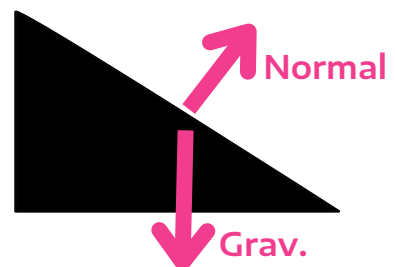
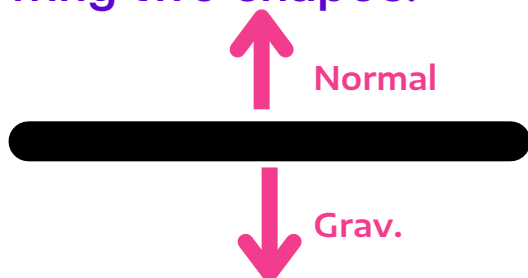
3. What did Famous Families in Europe use mazes for?
