
Founding SRA President Jack Butler ~ 1924 - 2012 ~

John Francis Butler, age 88, of Orange and formerly of Hamden, widower of Muriel Bernier Butler, passed away on Friday, March 30, 2012 in his home. Jack was born in New Haven, CT and lived in Orange for many years. He retired from SNET, working as a Manager for facilities planning. He served with pride, honor and distinction in the U.S. Air force during World War II, 8th Air Force European Theatre, serving with the 413th Engineering Group. He was a founding member and served as the President of the SNET Retiree Association. He was also a past member with the SNET Telephone Pioneers and was past president of the 305th Bomb Squadron Group, a member of the Morris F. Tyler Chapter, past president of New Haven East Life Member Club, New Haven Gridiron Club, former president and secretary of Orange Exchange Club, board member, Orange Chamber of Commerce. Mr. Butler is survived by his devoted daughter Lisa Laatsch and her husband Mark of Altoona, WI, stepdaughter

Cindy Krusz of Bloomfield, CT, two grandchildren, Mathew and Daniel Laatsch of WI, one niece Nancy Berryman and many close friends. Jack funeral was held on April 5. In lieu of flowers donations to the Orange Foundation, P.O. Box 729, Orange, CT. 06477 were requested. The SRA membership made donation in Jack's memory.

His beliefs brought Jack to the forefront of the SNET/SBC merger in 1998 when he petitioned the DPUC to force a dialog about the future of current retirees due to the pending merger. Jack's perseverance as well as always being the perfect gentleman spoke for all retirees and through his efforts the DPUC included language that protected the current retirees at the time in the merger agreement.

No other group was recognized in the DPUC's approval of the merger. For his efforts and the respect he had earned over the years the SRA was formed.



Along with other founding members they had the foresight to formalize their coffee group, create a non-profit organization which included by laws, a board of directors, publicity, tax id #'s, postal permits, logos, a newsletter, district/area reps to grow the group, dues structure and so much more. To say that Jack is missed at our board meetings and the Annual picnic just does not cover it.

Study: AT&T paid CEO more than Uncle Sam in 2011

AT&T Inc. was among 26 large companies that paid their CEOs more last year than they did in federal income tax, according to a study by a Washington D.C. think tank.

The Institute for Policy Studies said that AT&T CEO Randall Stephenson received total compensation in 2011 or \$18.7 million, while the Dallas-based telecom services company received a \$420 million federal tax refund.

"Capital intensive telecom firms like AT&T are major beneficiaries of new 'accelerated depreciation' rules that allow companies to turbo-charge tax deductions in the early years of the life of an asset," the organization's report said. "A 2009 accelerated depreciation rule saved the company \$5.2 billion on their 2011 taxes."

In a statement, AT&T retorted that it paid a total of \$3.8 billion in taxes last year.

"In 2010, we paid hundreds of millions in federal income taxes. It's misleading to focus on a single jurisdiction in one year when our tax liability fluctuates so much annually," AT&T's statement said.

The firm added: "The whole point of the stimulus legislation was to encourage investment by allowing companies to immediately depreciate assets that normally would have been deducted over a five- to fifteen-year period."

IMPORTANT CELL PHONE INFO

4 THINGS YOU MIGHT NOT HAVE KNOWN ABOUT YOUR CELL PHONE

FOR ALL THE FOLKS WITH CELL PHONES.

(This should be printed and kept in your car, purse, and wallet. Good information to have with you.)

There are a few things that can be done in times of grave emergencies. Your mobile phone can actually be a life saver or an emergency tool for survival.

Check out the things that you can do with it:

FIRST (Emergency):

The Emergency Number worldwide for Mobile is 112. If you find yourself out of the coverage area of your mobile network and there is an Emergency, dial 112 and the mobile will search any existing network to establish the emergency number for you, and interestingly, this number 112 can be dialed even if the keypad is locked. Try it out.

SECOND (Hidden Battery Power)

Imagine your cell battery is very low. To activate, press the keys *3370#. Your cell phone will restart with this reserve and the instrument will show a 50% increase in battery. This reserve will get charged when you charge your cell phone next time.

THIRD (How to disable a STOLEN mobile phone?)

To check your Mobile phone's serial number, key in the following Digits on your phone: *#06#

A 15-digit code will appear on the screen. This number is unique to our handset. Write it down and keep it somewhere safe.

If your phone is stolen, you can phone your service provider and give them this code. They will then be able to block your handset so even if the thief changes the SIM card, your phone will be totally useless. You probably won't get your phone back, but at least you know that whoever stole it can't use/sell it either. If everybody does this, there would be no point in people stealing mobile phones. And Finally...

FOURTH (Free Directory Service for Cells)

Cell phone companies are charging us \$1.00 to \$1.75 or more for 411 information calls when they don't have to. Most of us do not carry a telephone directory in our vehicle, which makes this situation even more of a problem. When you need to use the 411 information option, simply dial:

(800) FREE411 or (800) 373-3411

without incurring any charge at all. Program this into your cell phone now. This is sponsored by McDonald's.

This is the kind of information people don't mind receiving, so pass it on to your family and friends.





AT&T Agrees to Acquire NextWave Wireless, Inc.

On August 2, AT&T announced that it has agreed to acquire NextWave Wireless, Inc. NextWave holds licenses in the Wireless Communication Services (WCS) and Advanced Wireless Service (AWS) bands. WCS spectrum was first auctioned in 1997, but has not been utilized for mobile Internet usage due to technical rules designed to avoid possible interference to satellite radio users in adjacent spectrum bands.

- » The SRA is pleased to announce that Harry Green from Bridgeport and Frank Pagerino of Shelton have joined the SRA Board of Directors. We welcome them to our board and thank them for their commitment to our founding principles.
- » The SRA has a new mailing address.... We have moved our Post Office Box location to Southington for the convenience of our officers who will be checking the mail. The new address is: SRA P.O. Box 615 Southington, CT. 06489.
- Yes, there will be Florida meeting in 2013. The dates and locations will be arranged and shared as soon as possible.
- » We want to extend our thanks to our fellow member Don Hurteau for again providing the great music at the SRA picnic. Don is a "one man band" with great a variety of music and accompaniment. He has always been there for the first guest arrival to the last departure. Thanks again, Don.
- » Also a note of thanks to Norma Zenkus, (newly retired) who assisted with this newsletter converting so many different document formats to workable documents for JoAnn to get this newsletter completed.
- » As of January 1, 2013 the Federal Government mandates that anyone who is receiving a Social Security check must (and they mean must) have an account that allows direct deposit. The government will no longer mail any Social Security checks. Also, when doing your federal taxes there is an option to have any money that is to be refunded also be direct deposited. Call our credit unions to help you set up all of your direct deposit needs.
- » Did you know that if you have two residences (example: one in CT and one in FL) and you change your address with the benefits or pension offices of AT&T from CT to FL you will lose any concessions you currently have in CT. That is because the concession info is driven by your permanent address on file with AT&T.
- » Be sure that your family members are aware that should you or anyone on your health plan be admitted to a hospital someone must notify

- the insurance carrier within 24 hours of your admittance. This is your responsibility, not the hospitals'. You could be denied benefit coverage.
- » In April we were notified by AT&T of a change to life insurance provisions. The notification came in the form of a booklet commonly known as an <u>SMM</u>. We had to verify with AT&T that the changes to the life insurance plan did not impact any amounts of coverage nor the discontinuation of coverage. The change that we were notified of was that if someone's "life expectancy is <u>24 months</u> an eligible retiree can apply for the benefit" in advance of death. The change was from 12 months to 24 months which is better for the retiree. No other changes were made to the death benefit or life insurance.
- » There is a Cancer Resource Service for those enrolled in the AT&T Medical Plan. You can use this resource for assistance on understanding treatment plans and options, cancer diagnoses and access to providers and services at leading cancer centers and so much more. Hours of operation are: Mon – Fri. 7 AM to & PM Central time 1- 866-936-6002.
- » Remember to sign up for Medicare Part B premium reimbursements once you go on Medicare. It is your responsibility to do this for yourself and your dependents. The number to call is 1-877-722-0020.
- The SRA is pleased to announce to the membership that we will be submitting a shareholder proposal for the AT&T 2013 Annual Shareholder Meeting. The proposal will be finalized for submission in early November to the Company. We have obtained dual sponsorship from ACER which is the Legacy AT&T retiree group headed by Jane Banfield. Additionally, CWA/CUTW Local 1298 which also holds shares has agreed to support our efforts, and the retiree organization of the CUTW has also indicated their support of our draft proposal. Shareholder proposals allow us to say anything at the annual meeting, which is nothing less than a golden opportunity for press coverage which the company does not like if it is not good. In some cases shareholder proposals can

be withdrawn if the company and the submitting parties reach a resolution on other matters important to the group. We will provide the exact proposal details in our next newsletter and will ask all members and their families and friends who hold AT&T shares to support our efforts.

- In June, SuperMedia informed almost 3,000 retirees who were unwilling transferred from Verzion Directory Operations to then Idearc that then went bankrupt and came back as SuperMedia that their health benefits would be reduced or eliminated. The company cut up to 75% of the amount of money the company would contribute to health, dental and life insurance plans for 2012 and they may see additional increases in 2013. Some Medicare eligible retirees from this group were eliminated completely from all coverage. Pensions (protected under ERISA) were not impacted.
- As some of you are aware the AT&T Pension fund has become underfunded due to the stock market decline in past years, just as some of your own portfolios saw declines. There is no plan to fund the plan at this point as we understand. And to say the least with an underfunded plan it would be doubtful to see a pension increase. As a comparison Verizon's plan has been underfunded for several years. In 2008; by \$2.6 Billion and in the last reporting year of 2011 by \$6.5 Billion.
- » GM offered to white collar retirees and surviving beneficiaries a lump sum pension payment. This would enable GM to cut pension obligations by 24% according to reports in the media. Also, it was reported that GM bought a group annuity policy to manage the remaining pension obligations. This was a major choice for some younger retirees due to inflation, low interest on investments, current health, etc...Union workers were not offered the buyout.

Veteran Information to Increase your Social Security Payments

Since 1957, if you had military service earnings for active duty (including active duty for training), you paid Social Security taxes on those earnings. Since 1988, inactive duty service in the Armed Forces reserves (such as weekend drills) has also been covered by Social Security.

Under certain circumstances, special extra earnings for your military service from 1957 through 2001 can be credited to your record for Social Security purposes. These extra earnings credits may help you qualify for Social Security or increase the amount of your Social Security benefit.

Special extra earnings credits are granted for periods of active duty or active duty for training. Special extra earnings credits are not granted for inactive duty training.

If your active military service occurred: From 1957 through 1967, SS will add the extra credits to your record when you apply for Social Security benefits.

From 1968 through 2001, you do not need to do anything to receive these extra credits. The credits were automatically added to your record.

Regarding Social Security amounts if you are a Veteran: In January 2002, Public Law 107-117, the Defense Appropriations Act, stopped the special extra earnings that have been credited to military service personnel. Military service in calendar year 2002 and future years no longer qualifies for these special extra earnings credits. How You Get Credit For Special Extra Earnings

The information that follows applies only to active duty military service earnings from 1957 through 2001. Here's how the special extra earnings are credited on your record:

Service in 1957 through 1977: You are credited with \$300 in additional earnings for each calendar quarter in which you received active duty basic pay.

Service in 1978 through 2001: For every \$300 in active duty basic pay, you are credited with an additional \$100 in earnings up to a maximum of \$1,200 a year. If you enlisted after September 7, 1980, and didn't complete at least 24 months of active duty or your full tour, you may not be able to receive the additional earnings. Check with Social Security for details.
