- Requirement for CDEM Groups to recognise and plan for the needs and contribution of Māori

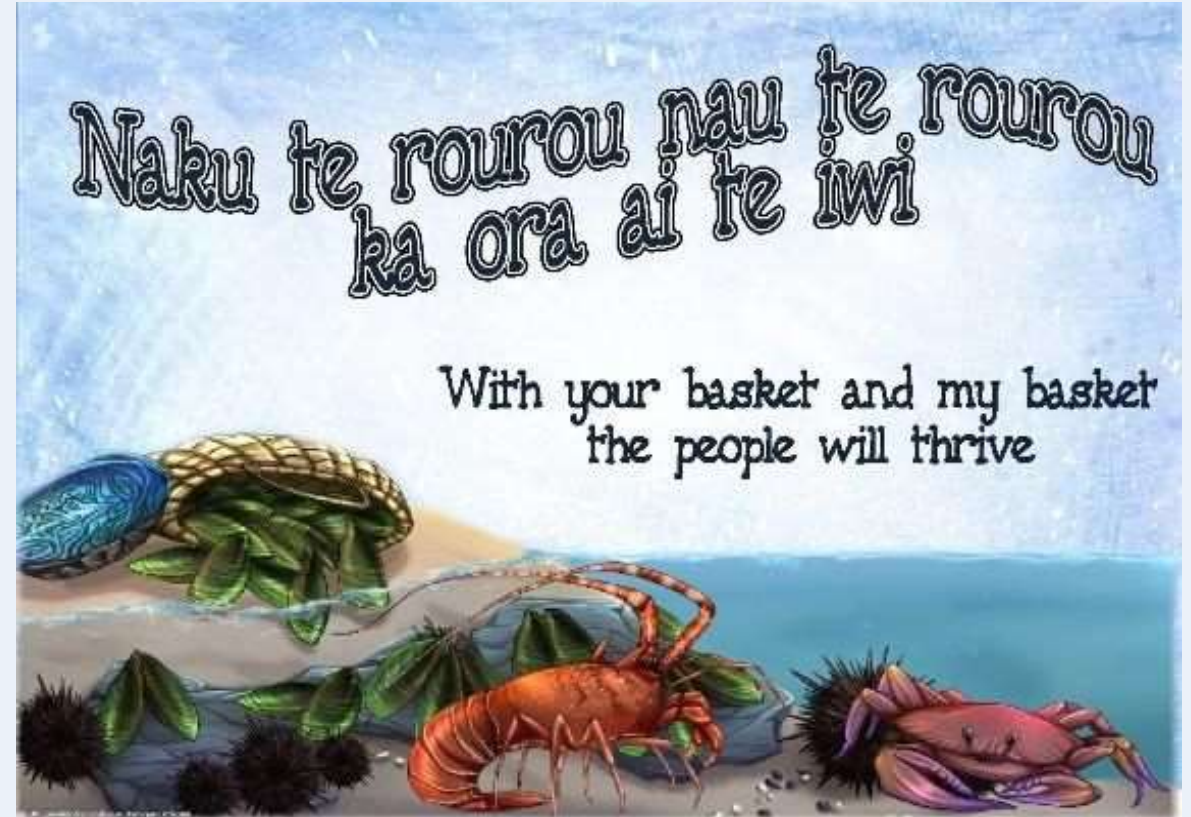
