
Background




Since 2001, program participants have saved 76 cubic feet per second (34,111 gallons per minute), 18,300 acre-feet of water per year, working in 25 different tributaries in 10 counties.

Significant Adaptations

a. Trust Water Rights Absolute

- i. Trusted water savings on case by case
 - 1. Public benefit creation or perpetuation
 - 2.project water complexity
- b. Water right verification vs. validity & extent investigation
- c. Programmatic cost-share rate cap
- d. Sixteen pages down to five pages
- e. Allowing for system upgrades/revisions as well as new
- f. Application and Contract alignment with other SCC programs
- g. Addition of District Implemented Projects (DIP)
