

Capital Budget

- Conservation Reserve Enhancement
 Program (CREP) Proviso Change
- Allow use of state funds to support landowners disenrolled by FSA
- Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP)
 - No new funding, can meet need from prior appropriations
- Sustainable Farms and Fields
 - \$24.9 million moved from Operating to
 Capital






Operating Budget

- Conservation Technical Assistance (CTA)
 - Requested \$10 million
 - Appropriated additional \$3.5 million
 - Total Biennium Funding \$4.5 million
- SCC FTEs
 - Requested \$600,000 Appropriated \$200,000

District Direct Appropriation

- Central and Eastern Klickitat CDs appropriated
 \$500,000 for post-wildfire recovery work
- Organic and Climate-Smart Agriculture Study
 - Deadline moved to May 1, 2025



Request Legislation

- **SB 5921**, Concerning tribal representation on the state conservation commission
- Sponsors: Stanford, Van De Wege,
 Conway, Hasegawa, Liias, Nguyen,
 Nobles, Trudeau, Valdez
- Unanimously passed Senate
- Hearing in House Ag & Natural
 Resources Committee, no action in
 Executive Session

Initiatives

- Six initiatives submitted by public petitions
- Action on:
 - Prohibiting state and local income tax
 - Codifying parental access to public school materials
 - Removing certain restrictions on police vehicular pursuits
- No action:
 - Repealing the Climate Commitment Act
 - Repealing the Capital Gains Tax
 - Allowing for opt-out of state's long-term care tax





Climate Commitment Act - \$86 Million

Riparian Work

- 2023-2025 CREP (\$11 million)
- Riparian Grant Program (\$25 million)
- Salmon Riparian Funding (\$3 million)
- Community Education Campaign (\$2 million)

Sustainable Agriculture

- Sustainable Farms and Fields (\$30 million)
- Organic and Climate-Smart Agriculture Study (\$200,000)

What is funded in CCA?

Riparian Work

- . 2023-25 CREP (\$11 million) to provide matching state funds for management and implementation to continue the Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program with private landowners.
- Riparian Restoration with Landowners (\$25 million) to run a voluntary riparian grant program for riparian restoration and protection using the best available, locally applicable science. Develop and implement a framework that includes monitoring, adaptive management, and metrics.
- Salmon Riparian Habitat Restoration (\$3 million) to support the outreach, identification, and implementation of salmon riparian habitat restoration projects appropriated through the capital budget.
- Education Communication Plan (\$2 million) to develop and implement an educational communication plan for the general public and landowners in urban, suburban, rural, agricultural, and forested areas regarding the importance of riparian buffers and the actions they can take to protect and enhance these critical areas.

Sustainable Agriculture

- . Sustainable Farms and Fields Grants (\$30 million) to expand climate-smart livestock management practices including anaerobic digesters on dairy farms, increasing the SFF budget to provide more TA/FA to producers, and funding research and demonstration projects that focus on innovative and beneficial practices that reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
- Organic and Climate Smart Agriculture (\$200,000) to conduct an evaluation of the current contribution that organic and climate smart gariculture makes toward Washington's climate response goals, what potential there is for increasing this contribution, and how additional investments will help realize this potential, while supporting resiliency.

Forest Health & Community Wildfire Resiliency

- · Address Unhealthy Forests (\$5 million) SCC will work with conservation districts to address unhealthy forests and build greater community resiliency.
- Reduce Forest Fuel Grants (\$10 million) for SCC to provide grants to local government and private landowners for Firewise projects to reduce forest fuel loading in areas deemed a high hazard for wildfire.

- . Community Engagement Plan (\$250,000) for the completion of a an agency community engagement plan and grants to districts for community engagement work on the ground.
- . Climate Response Strategy (\$23,000) to cover staff time to represent SCC priorities in the statewide Integrated Climate Response Strategy.




Riparian Roundtable

- Developed four agency actions:
 - Science Coordination, Training, and Workforce
 Development for Conservation District Staff
 - Agricultural Viability and Farmland Preservation
 - Water and Natural Resources Resilience
 - Community Resilience to a Changing Climate
- Climate Resiliency Priority Area of SCC strategic plan
