# Mayor's Corner

Can you believe that we are into September already? Where has 2021 gone? I wanted to take a minute to address some concerns regarding several traffic changes that have recently been made in town. As the town continues to grow, we currently have a population of approximately 3,000, Council is evaluating the street plan and looking at ways to promote safety and protect our residents. We are aware concerns have been expressed about the installation of the stop signs along Park Avenue. These were installed at the request of many property owners in that residential area, since much of the traffic there is a result of using the street as a cutthrough to the Food Lion shopping center. Speed has been an issue there as well. A remedy to address that, was to install the stop signs at the cross streets to slow traffic and improve safety for those who live and travel along the street. The Town's police department conducted a traffic study of this area in late June and early July. The study recorded 475 cars in a 13-hour period, an average of almost 40 cars each hour. Also, there have been report-

ed accidents along the street

involving a vehicle into a tree, mailboxes being hit, and cars running into the guard rail at 2<sup>nd</sup> Street. The safest route for most in Town, and visitors from the west side of town to the shopping center, is to use 3<sup>rd</sup> Street (Route 256) to Augusta Avenue (Route 340). These routes are designed to safely handle this amount of traffic, while Park Avenue is not. Also, earlier this year, at the request of property owners, several stop ahead signs were installed along Holly Avenue to give better notice to drivers. This hopefully prevents the number of persons running the stop signs and improves safety in that area.

There have also been changes to the parking along Dogwood Avenue in the area of Lil' Gus'. Concerns increased as vehicles parked in front of the building were encroaching onto the street. Signage has been installed to help inform restaurant patrons of the new parking conditions. Town officials had conversations with the owners prior to making those changes. Once again, the goal is to provide for safe travel in our town. The Town Council's Street Committee is looking at other improvements such

as crosswalks, etc. This will alert drivers to slow down and will provide greater safety to those that walk along some of the busier streets. Council wants to hear from you. Not all decisions will make everyone happy, but please know that our goal is provide for a safe town for pedestrians and for property owners.

Grottoes has much to offer. We are a regional tourist attraction with Grand Caverns, parks, pool, and other amenities that attract visitors to our town. During the month of July our Caverns and parks had their highest earnings to date! Council wants to keep that momentum going. We encourage feedback from citizens, as we continue to make improvements like addressing traffic issues, bringing businesses to our town, having entertainment and music events, maintaining our beautiful parks, assuring compliance with Town ordinances, maintaining our water and sewer infrastructure, and more! The Grottoes Council's goal is to make proactive decisions not just for today but for tomorrow and many years to come.

# **A Growing Grottoes**

The US Census Bureau released data from the 2020 census. Following is information for the Town as compiled by the Central Shenandoah Planning District Commission. As you can see from this chart, the growth rate of the Town has been significant over the past 20 years. Though the rate slowed from 2010—2020 over the previous decade, town staff has seen a sharp increase in zoning permits for new homes recently. Since the beginning of 2021, 68 permits for new dwellings, including townhomes and single family homes, have been issued. With increased building comes increased population and increased need for municipal services like water and sewer, an increase in traffic throughout town, and the potential for new businesses. While It is difficult to project what will happen with population and growth in Grottoes over the next 10 years; it is certain that the town will need to continue to invest in our services and infrastructure, to work toward the goals of economic growth and a high standard of municipal services.


