- We have made it through 8 weeks of school and have had 7 positive COVID cases so far in our building. We have had 2 students switch to eLearning because of the increase in COVID numbers in our area, which brings our total full time eLearners to 7. Our actual eLearning numbers fluctuate week to week as anyone home because quarantining also attend school via eLearning.

- We are finalizing our numbers from our candy bar sales. We still waiting to receive money from a few students. We have 10 cases that have not been sold.
- We had parent teacher conferences on October 5th. We had 53% parent attendance, which is much lower than normal fall conferences.

- The Cavalier Golf Classic was held Saturday, September 19, 2020 @ Lee Park. We had 35 teams registered with 32 teams playing. We had 22 participating teams last year. This was our most profitable tournament to date. Thank you everyone for your help and participation in the tournament.
- The Hall of Fame banquet was held Saturday, September 26, 2020. The 2020 inductees include: Academics/Arts—Jeff Hurlbert, Athletics—Cary Hornaman, Benefactor/Founder—Ken and Dee Fielder Family, Employee—Rose Kraft, Volunteer—Todd Zens.
