- We currently have 21 Kindergarten students registered for the 2022-2023 school year.
- We continue to conduct tours, field questions, and have students participating in shadow days.
- Fall fundraiser items have all arrived and have been delivered. There were some delays with distribution.
- Several teachers along with administrators attended a Cognia Accreditation workshop in Chamberlain. This workshop was designed to help facilitate the preparation of our system review that is set for January 2022.
- Many of our RES classrooms are taking part in Junior Achievement. We are very thankful for those members in our community who volunteered their time to offer this experience.
- PTO met on November 16 to discuss the Blessing Store and CSW. There were 15 people
 in attendance. They continue to talk through their ideas for the future of the RPS
 playground.
- The Kindergarten students participated in their Thanksgiving feast on November 22nd. This is a tradition that is unique and special to them.
