 - New students registered for fall of 2022- 22
 - Current student leaving- 3 (2 moving, 1 in town transfer).
 - Projected 2022-2023 enrollment- 479.
 - Goal for ACSS: by the year 2029 the average class size, grades K-12, will be 43. This would mean an enrollment of 559.

- We currently have 40 Kindergarten students registered for the 2022-2023 school year with 2 additional families discerning retention.
- The following are the K - 6 class counts to date:
K - 40 + 2; **1st** - 52 + 2; **2nd** – 40; **3rd** – 38; **4th** – 41; **5th** – 32; **6th** - 43
- The 4th graders attended agriculture day at a local farm.
- The PreK-6 students have a variety of field trip experiences planned for the remainder of the school year.
- Our 6th grade students participated in their first Jr. High track meet in Ipswich on May 2nd. They will also be competing on Monday, May 9th.
- The 6th grade students spent Wednesday, May 4th at the JH/HS for shadow day.
- The 2nd graders will spend Wednesday, May 11th at RES for their shadow day.
- The final RPS/RES joint mass of the school year will be held at Sacred Heart on Wednesday, May 11th at 12:10. The Teacher of the Year will be announced.
- The RES students celebrated May Crowning of Mary on Wednesday, May 4th and the RPS students celebrated May Crowning of Mary on Thursday, May 5th.
- All positions have been filled at RPS and RES for the 2022-2023 school year.
- The PTO Spring Fling Carnival took place on Sunday, May 1st. It was a very successful event.
- The PTO honored our PreK-6 grade teachers for National Teacher Appreciation Week. Treats of snacks, coffee, breakfast and lunch were delivered each day from May 2-6.
- New curriculum for the 2022-2023 has begun to arrive in order to avoid supply chain issues. Teachers are scheduled to complete online training for the new math, and phonics curriculum over the summer.
- K-6 has adopted Sophia Press “Spirit of Truth” religion curriculum for the 2022-2023 school year.
- We continue to conduct tours and field questions about Roncalli. We have had students shadowing in several grade levels.
- The 5th and 6th grade teachers and I have been meeting to look at the structure of those grades going forward, to make sure that we have a great plan to meet the needs of all students. We will be returning to modified self-contained 5th and 6th grade classrooms next year. This will result in a better overall experience for our students.
- Teachers continue to participate in the LETRS literacy training course. This is a two-year training program that focuses on “how” kids learn to read. This is part of a new literacy focus aimed at making sure each student is successful in reading.

RICK KLINE:

- The Cavalier Classic Golf tournament is scheduled for Monday, September 12, 2022 @ Lee Park.
- Nominations were taken for the 2022 Roncalli Hall of Fame. Nominees have been selected and we are waiting on their acceptance. Hall of Fame banquet is set for Saturday, October 8, 2022.
- The next event on the Calendar for the Cavalry is the Annual Cavalier Blast Trap shoot. Our goal this year is to have 30 teams participate. To date we have 18 teams and seven sponsors. The date of the event is set for June 23, 2022 at the Aberdeen Gun Club.
