- We are ready for our workshop on Block Scheduling which will be held on the 13th.
- We will start painting the hallways once the new lighting is installed. And we will finish the lunchroom once Drivers Ed is completed.
- ACT Aspire score are coming in for grades 3-7. Hopefully those will be finalized by the end of June.
- Here are a few highlights that we shared at our table at the One Vine Event:
 - Class of 2022 accepted over 1 million dollars in scholarships and grants.
 - ACT: Class of 2022: 22.3
 - Class of 2022 College Credits: 21 students (91%) took 104 College classes with GPA 3.78

- The 2nd graders spent Wednesday, May 11th at RES for their shadow day. They enjoyed time in the STREAMLab, tours with our GRC students and interviews with the 3rd graders. They had a picnic lunch with the 3rd graders and attended the end of the year mass.
- The final RPS/RES joint mass of the school year was held at Sacred Heart on Wednesday, May 11th at 12:10. The PreK - 6 Teacher of the Year was announced, Mr. Terry Dosch. Terry received the most nominations from his peers. We are grateful for his dedication to the mission of Roncalli.
- We had a great end to the 2021-2022 school year. Many classes went on field trips and the tradition of "fun day" with Mr. Dosch was also a success. The RES students enjoyed awards day and we bid farewell to our graduating 6th graders with a special ceremony and slide show. Fr. Schulte offered a blessing over our 6th graders and the students sang the blessing song as a final goodbye.
- We also said goodbye to Cheryl Kolb, Kiana Beutler, Megan Ogren and Ashley Brudvig. We wish them well on the next chapter of their stories.
- We currently have 46 Kindergarten students registered for the 2022-2023 school year with 1 additional family discerning retention. This enrollment requires a 3rd section to accommodate the number of students. We are growing, which is very exciting! The two registrations that put us over our allowed number of students, were actually current Roncalli families. Without the ability to open a 3rd classroom, I would have needed to tell those families that their child is on a waiting list.
- The summer OST program "Camp Kindness" is in full swing led by Shelby Braun. The program is full with 82 students registered and a few more on a waitlist. They are enjoying park and pool time when the weather allows, with lots of fun indoor activities as well.
- Our new faculty are beginning to arrive to see their classrooms.
- Craig Hartman's last day was May 27th. We are grateful for his dedication to Roncalli and his service to the needs of our students and staff at RPS.
- Natasha Fliehs took over the custodial duties at RPS on Tuesday, May 31st. She has been training and job sharing with Kathy Andersen at RES since March. We welcome Natasha

and we look forward to many years with her leading the facilities management efforts at RPS.

- New curriculum for the 2022-2023 has begun to arrive in order to avoid supply chain issues. Teachers are scheduled to complete online training for the new math, and phonics curriculum over the summer.
- K-6 has adopted Sophia Press “Spirit of Truth” religion curriculum for the 2022-2023 school year.
- The In School with Jesus curriculum has arrived for PreK - 6. This bible focused curriculum is designed as a consistent school journey and is habit forming. Each classroom will begin their day using this process. We are setting the example that when we put God first and dig into His teachings we will see fruit and wonderful things will happen. This daily practice shows all of our students that we do the most important thing first - pray!
- The 5th and 6th grade will be returning to modified self-contained 5th and 6th grade classrooms next year. This will result in a better overall experience for our students.
- Teachers continue to participate in the LETRS literacy training course. This is a two year training program that focuses on “how” kids learn to read. This is part of a new literacy focus aimed at making sure each student is successful in reading.
- We continue to conduct tours and field questions about Roncalli.

- Boys' Tennis wrapped up its season getting 8th place at State A Tennis in Rapid City. We are excited to see what the future holds for our young tennis team.
- Track and Field finished up the three-day State Meet in Sioux Falls. They switched this year's event to a three-day meet instead of a two-day meet like in previous years. This last week Jayden Munroe got 4th in the triple jump, Mason Carrels got 5th in the pole vault, Morgan Fiedler got 3rd in the long jump, 7th in the 100 meter dash, and won the triple jump. Jayden Munroe, Matthew Martinez, Mason Carrels, and Brody Weinmeister got 3rd in the 4x400 meter relay. Our boys finished 18th in class B with a total of 15 points. Our girls finished 15th in class B with a total of 18 points.
- Girl's golf finished in 4th place at the region golf tournament in Madison. We qualified three girls to the State Golf meet in Tea. Girls that qualified are Claire Crawford, Margaret Anderson, and Grace Seyer. The state tournament is scheduled for June 6th and 7th.
- Summer activities are already underway.
 - Boys and girls basketball has a summer camp and summer league for athletes in grades 4-8. Both the boys and girls basketball have open gyms scheduled two days per week in the summer and team camps they will be attending.
 - Volleyball is having open gyms two days per week, playing in a league on Mondays, and attending team camps.
 - Football has lifting/ agility 4 days per week and are attending team camps throughout the summer months.
 - Cross country has a summer camp towards the end of the summer.
- We are beginning to order new uniforms for next season. We are trying to get back onto a five-year cycle for uniforms. For next year we are ordering new track/ cross country uniforms, volleyball, and girls/boys tennis.
