## TAMMY KOST:

- Grandparent's Day was celebrated on September 21st at RES and September 22nd at RPS. A variety of activities as well as refreshments were enjoyed, and we had an amazing turnout.
- The Lunchtime Solutions breakfast offering has been popular at RPS with an average of 15-20 students eating daily. The number of students at RES is under 7.
- RPS and RES held parent-teacher conferences at RPS on October 5th. We continue to have a high rate of attendance. Those who cannot attend are encouraged to make private arrangements with their child's teacher for an alternate date and time.
- Fr. Andrew visits the PreK 2nd grade classrooms on Tuesdays.
- Fr. Mitchell has begun visiting the classrooms at RES. On Friday, October 1st, Fr. Mitchell performed a Eucharistic Procession through the halls and the classrooms at RES. This was a beautiful, humbling experience.
- Altar Server and Eucharistic Ministers training has been completed.
- Mr. Stone and I met to begin creating plans for his new role in Campus Ministry. He spent some time in the K-2 classrooms introducing himself to the students. He read a story and conducted a short activity. He has been teaching the diocesan Circle of Grace curriculum to the 3rd-grade students and he will be teaching the Ruah Woods Theology of the Body curriculum to our K-2 students every month. We have carved out some time on Tuesdays and Thursdays for him to be at RPS.
- Our 6th-grade students have been participating in fall activities with the 7th and 8th-grade students.
- The PreK-6th grade students participated in Red Ribbon Week. Activities focused on making good choices and avoiding drugs and alcohol.
- The 5th and 6th-grade students that were chosen for the Golden Rule Crew were announced. This group of 5th and 6th-grade students participated in a retreat where they were exposed to leadership training as well planning for the year.
- The GRC performed skits for the K-4th grade students during Red Ribbon Week. The skits focused on making good choices.
- RPS and RES exceeded their sales goal with World's Finest Chocolates. Top sellers were Isabelle Fouts selling 13 cases and Kadince Glynn selling 16 cases. Prizes and awards will be given and celebrated over the next few weeks.
- Our 6th-grade students have begun to work with the Dacotah Prairie Museum with the Docent program.
- The 5th and 6th-grade students attended the Roncalli Marching Band Competition to show support for their 7-12 grade counterparts.

- The K 6th-grade students have completed their fall NWEA Map tests. The teachers have gone through training on how to administer the tests and how to retrieve and interpret the data. This data will allow us to target the needs of each student and tailor interventions to meet their needs.
- The Sisters from Pro Ecclesia Santa visited the students at RPS and RES. The students enjoyed their visit and are wanting to have them visit again in the future.
- Jessica Schneider, Roncalli alum, Roncalli parent, and Walk Out of Darkness chairperson, visited our PreK-4th grade rooms to share an age-appropriate book about mental health. I also brought in my dog, Toby, to help bring her story to life.
- The Aberdeen Fire Department made a visit to RPS to discuss fire safety with our Kindergarten and 1st-grade students. The PreK students participated in field trips to the fire station.
- Mr. Stone and his 5th grade students led the RES students in a rosary in the gym to pray for all life and their own personal intentions.
- The 1st quarter ended on October 21st, with grades recorded and report cards sent home on Friday, October 28th. I am diligently working with administrators from other schools to revamp our report card process. I would like to move to standards-based grading and reporting, beginning with 1st and 2nd grade. I will phase in 3rd-5th over the next couple of years. This type of grading and reporting will give families a clearer picture of their child's competency and knowledge.
- On Monday, October 24th, Fr. Mitchell celebrated his birthday with the students at RES. He provided birthday cake for all the students and staff during their lunch.
- The classrooms are celebrating Halloween on Monday, October 31st with Fall Festival parties in their rooms. Appropriate costumes may be worn for a short time near the end of the day.
- Mass will be moved to November 1st @12:10 for RES and RPS for All Saint's Day. The JH students will join the RPS students at St. Mary's and the HS students will join with the RES students at Sacred Heart.

- The Hall of fame banquet was held Saturday, October 8, 2022. Approximately 160 people were in attendance. Thank you to Coach Young and the football team for attending and showing their appreciation for all the recipients. By holding the banquet and inviting our student-athletes, we enhanced our duty to foster missionary discipleship among the staff and students of the ACSS and better promote our Catholic identity.

- Girls tennis finished its season getting 10th place at the state tennis tournament in Rapid City. The future is bright for our young team. We didn't have any seniors and only one junior on this year's squad.
- We hosted region and state golf this year at Moccasin Creek Country Club. We were very thankful for the 75 volunteers who helped at the two events. Our young golf team had a great showing winning the Region 1A golf tournament and placing Runner Up (2nd) at the state golf tournament. Finn Anderson tied for 8th and Sawyer Henrich tied for 19th at the event.
