TIM WEISZ:

- The Rise Up Roncalli initiative continues to progress. Upon the completion of the Bus/Maintenance storage facility, we have set the stage for moving the Band. Our hope is that all work in the current phase (Phase II) of the project will be completed in time for the 2023-2024 school year. Phase III of Rise Up Roncalli includes: 1) continued work on the roof, 2) Chapel renovation, 3) JH/HS Parking lot.
- Regarding 2023-2024 staffing, we are currently advertising for three positions: K-5 SPED; Elementary (2nd grade) Teacher; 9-12 Science/Business Teacher. We have two staff members not returning next year. Mrs. Donna Herrick and Mr. Eric Swenson. Please join me in wishing them the very best as they move on to different opportunities. All contracts that were issued are signed and returned.
- Development of a comprehensive set of Catholic Standards for ACSS is going quite well.
 Our goal is to have these standards ready for review by this fall with full implementation in the fall of 2024.

PAULA FLOREY:

- We have hired Casey Steele as our 9-12 SPED teacher. Casey is a 1976 RHS graduate.
- Current Openings: science/business position. We have someone interested in the ½ business, but no applications currently for the science.
- Our Middle School teachers have been working hard on creating our middle school concept for next year. We will have the current 6th graders come up for a visit on the 19th and the current 5th graders May 3rd.
- We have received all the ACT testing results from the March testing. Our juniors did very well with 8 students scoring 28 or higher. Congratulations to Paul Gutenkauf, Landon Zikmund, Bryce Falken who all scored 30 so they will have their names on the ACT board. Palmer Johnson increased his score so he will be moving up on the ACT board. We have not had time to analyze the 8-10 grade scores as they just came in. Mrs. Keller, Mrs. Litzen and I went to an ACT workshop to help us learn how to better use the test scores.

- Senator Rounds visited the JH/HS building on 4/12/2023 and talked to our students and answered their questions.
- We have decided to go to an 8-period day to finish out the school year to help combat the absences of the students due to athlete events being rescheduled and having students miss multiple days each week. It just gives the teacher more contact time with the kids.
- I'm currently working on scheduling and hope to have the MS schedule finished first as we are fully staffed. I will then move on to the HS. The goal is to have schedules out to all students by the time they leave.
- Mrs. Shishnia, Mrs. Heinz, Mrs. O'Keefe and I will be attending the TIE conference in Rapid City at the end of April.
- The NHS blood drive was held on April 13.
- The Spring Play will be performed on April 20-22.
- JH will participate in the music contest at Holgate on April 15th.
- We will once again have NSU student athletes here to do some community service on April 15th. Our hope is that we will get all the door frames painted in both wings of the building.

TAMMY KOST:

- Our 6th-grade students have begun participating in spring activities with the 7th and 8th-grade students.
- Our 5th and 6th grade students are practicing for their band contest at Holgate on Saturday, April 15th.
- Our 5th grade students presented the Living Stations on Thursday, April 13th at 12:45. This was a makeup date from the original date that got snowed out. A special thank you to Mrs. Fischer and Mr. Stone for their dedication to this presentation.

- A special thank you to RES custodian Kathy Andersen and Tom Hager for maintaining RPS in addition to their other duties as we searched for a custodian. RPS had been without a custodian for several months. Teachers and staff also pitched in to keep things rolling.
- RPS welcomes Emma Scherr as our custodian. She will work part-time until the end of the school year and then will begin full-time employment with us.
- The faculty and staff continue to meet to discuss the reconfiguration process that will start for the next school year.

- Bridge Building days are being planned for 1st and 2nd grade students at RES and 5th and 6th grade students are RMS. Mrs. Braun and staff are planning a fun filled day for each grade to begin the acclimation process to their new buildings.
- RPS and RES are seeking a 2nd grade teacher for the 3rd section. Also seeking a SpEd teacher as

- Preschool registration is in full swing and spots have been filling up. We will be able to accept more students next school year due to the reconfiguration of the building.
- We currently have 32 kindergarten students registered. Three additional preschool students' families are discerning kindergarten or preschool and three current kindergarten students are being evaluated for retention.
- The observations and assessments have been completed for the South Dakota Levels of Preschool Excellence. We have received the rating of "exemplary" and will be receiving our certification soon.
