





Project DELTA represented a partnership between Florida State College at Jacksonville, George Mason University and Iowa State University. This \$728,112 FIPSE-funded endeavor was designed to address the national need for postsecondary change in the approach to the retention and success of nontraditional students returning to college. Through a national consortium, DELTA provided a turnkey solution to meet college and university needs with a faculty development and textbook replacement model known as SIRIUS. SIRIUS provided a low-cost program for students, concentrating on general education courses, including those covering basic educational skills such as mathematics, reading, and English.

This plan focused on one of the greatest challenges encountered by community colleges – facilitating the success of students with academic skill deficiencies. Enhanced understanding, innovation and collaborative intervention were at the heart of the QEP effort. The plan involved college-wide participation through a unique "medical model" approach that drove 45 ongoing academic and support initiatives to improve the success of students who were placed in college preparatory (remedial) classes.
