A LETTER FROM OUR LEADERS

Dear Friends,

Looking back on Project Angel Food's 2018/2019 fiscal year (July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019) from the vantage point of the COVID-19 pandemic is both strange and encouraging. We had no idea what new challenges were around the bend, but the work you helped us accomplish during this year is enabling us to rise to the occasion and respond decisively and effectively to the crisis. We're delighted to have this opportunity to revisit this very productive time and the many programming updates we implemented with the support of our dedicated donors and volunteers.

Our clients are the reason we're all here, the reason you're reading this letter, and getting ready to turn the page to see their faces and the faces of the people who make it possible for us to deliver lifesaving nutrition to Angelenos in need. Across 4,000+ square miles of Los Angeles County we delivered meals to 200 more people a day and enrolled 100 more new clients than we did last year. However, the need for our services continues to grow and we closed the year with nearly 400 people on our waitlist. With your help, we can work toward expanding service in the years to come while celebrating what we've accomplished.

In last year's letter, we shared the groundbreaking news that we'd received funding from the State of California, along with our five sister agencies in the California Food is Medicine Coalition (CalFIMC), to launch a pilot program aimed at reducing hospital visits for patients with congestive heart failure (CHF). This year we're proud to say, with substantial startup funding from Project Angel Food Community Partner and Referral Agency L.A. Care Health Plan, that the pilot program is a huge success. We served 11,770 meals to 87 clients with CHF and reduced their rate of hospital readmissions by more than 5%. But most importantly, we improved their quality of life.

Delivering meals, hope, and comfort to our neighbors who are sick, hungry, and alone requires all of us to come together and give as much as we can. And you did! From individuals to corporations, from the public and private sectors, support for Project Angel Food from volunteers and donors surpassed our last fiscal year. Volunteers donated 1,500 more hours and donors generated a 5% increase in revenue. Despite the growing need in the community and the looming uncertainty of the future, we know we can count on you to continue our lifesaving mission.

FOOD IS MEDICINE IN ACTION



Project Angel Food prepares & delivers healthy meals to feed people impacted by serious illness, bringing comfort and hope every day.



IDENTIFYING PEOPLE IN NEED

Potential clients find us through our referral partners (you'll find the full list on page 18-19), word of mouth, and online searches. Our Client Services team, led by Director of Programs Robert Boller, guides each qualified individual through the intake process, which is unobtrusive and streamlined, and requires minimal paperwork. Our goal is to make it as easy as possible for people who are sick and hungry to get the food they need and the comfort and hope they deserve.



DESIGNING MEDICALLY TAILORED MEALS

Upon enrollment, clients receive a one-on-one nutritional assessment with one of our registered dietitians—like Nutrition Services Manager Alyssa Baldino—followed by routine assessments to monitor progress and revise medically tailored meal plans based on their malnutrition levels. We offer 39 menu combinations to accommodate our clients' dietary needs, including vegetarian options. Registered Dietitians monitor client responsiveness to meal plans, consult with clients' healthcare case managers, and analyze updated lab reports to optimize the effectiveness of each client's unique food "prescription."



PREPARING DELICIOUS & NUTRITIOUS FOOD


All meals are prepared daily at our 8,000 square foot kitchen facility which is 80% volunteer-driven. Our credentialed chefs and volunteers work six days a week under the guidance of Kitchen Manager John Gordon. Dishes are flavorful, aesthetically pleasing, and made with high quality ingredients selected by our dietitians. Meals include low-fat proteins to preserve lean body mass, antioxidant-rich vegetables to block the activity of free radicals, and protein-rich legumes to lower cholesterol and assist in blood sugar regulation.



DELIVERING COMFORT & HOPE

Drivers such as Tim Troester deliver seven meals (some receive 14) to clients' homes during the same four-hour window each week. For the 59% of our clients who live alone, our drivers may be the only human interaction they have that day or week. In 2019, we cooked and delivered 656,613 meals to 2,367 chronically and terminally ill residents in Los Angeles County. We also provided breakfast bags to 105 children of food insecure client families. In addition to meals, our drivers conduct wellness checks and deliver gift bags on birthdays and holidays.

Project Angel Food is the loving neighbor who knows that food is medicine, food is love, and food nourishes the soul. We believe no one fighting critical illness should go hungry, which is why we personally deliver, with care and compassion, free medically-tailored meals, handmade with healthy ingredients to those in our community who are hungry and alone.







OUR VOLUNTEERS

Project Angel Food's kitchen is 80% volunteer-driven, and even one day of volunteering can make a world of difference to our most vulnerable neighbors. Since 1989, we've delivered more than 12 million meals to 22,000+ critically ill people. This is made possible by the generosity of dedicated volunteers who help prepare meals, assist in our office, and staff our events.

In 2019 alone, 4,500 compassionate Angelinos pressed pause on their busy days and donated their time to our lifesaving work. Every single one of those volunteers is invaluable, but we wanted to highlight one in particular, Noemi Torres...

She's pictured here with her mother (who is also called Noemi) as they head out to deliver meals; something she's been doing since 2003 after picking up a Project Angel Food postcard at Big 5. She told us, "The first time I volunteered in the kitchen, I knew I belonged there. I keep coming back because I know the impact Project Angel Food has on the community." We're grateful to Noemi and the other 4,499 volunteers who make our mission possible.



CUSTOMIZED VOLUNTEER EXPERIENCE

Project Angel Food began offering Customized Volunteer Experiences in 2015 and since then we have partnered with over 50 corporations and organizations to create unique and meaningful volunteer events in our kitchen that build camaraderie and bring medically tailored meals to the homes of those most in need in Los Angeles County. Organizations that choose a Customized Volunteer Experience double their impact by donating both funds and time to Project Angel Food.




Our first ever Customized Volunteer Experience (CVE) was designed for Disney VoluntEARS and they've returned 19 times since to help out in the kitchen and at special events. After a busy four hours of service in the kitchen, the group photo above was taken in front of artist Collette Miller's famous angel wing mural. They had arrived at our kitchen at 8 a.m. one morning in February 2019, worked steadily chopping vegetables, scooped healthy-sized portions into containers, then sealed and labeled those containers as made with love by the Disney VoluntEARS. Since 2012 Disney has donated more than \$63,000 through our CVE program and matching employee gifts.


For every dollar donated to Project Angel Food, 84 cents goes directly to preparing and delivering medically tailored meals, comfort, and hope.

Community Partners and Referral Agencies are vital to our work on every level. They refer clients, help procure food and volunteers, contribute funding, and are true collaborators as we share resources to complete our respective missions. Food Forward and LA Regional Food Bank help us source the fresh ingredients that go into our medically tailored meals. LA LGBT Center and the City of West Hollywood connect us to volunteers, without whom we would not be able to fulfill our mission. And some partners, like L.A. Care Health Plan, refer clients and donate funds to programs that help us advocate for food as medicine.



L.A. Care Health Plan was founded in 1997 as California's local initiative Medi-Cal Managed Care health plan for Los Angeles County and since 2013 they have been a steadfast partner in helping to fulfill our mission. Our partnership with L.A. Care Health Plan ensures that our meals are being delivered to those who need them most and has been instrumental in launching the CHF pilot program.

L.A. Care Health Plan's \$150,000 grant has been vital to our collaboration with the California Food is Medicine Coalition on the statewide

congestive heart failure (CHF) pilot program. With these funds we were able to hire a bilingual registered dietitian dedicated to the program, which is actively reducing the number of hospital visits for patients with CHF. L.A. Care Health Plan has also sponsored Angel Awards and Angel Art events, provided funds for our very first refrigerated van, purchased hundreds of pies every Thanksgiving, and generously lent us their CEO John Baackes for our Board of Directors.

HISTORIC MILESTONES



1989-90

Marianne Williamson and a group of compassionate volunteers founded Project Angel Food to serve hot meals to Los Angeles residents suffering in silence from malnutrition and the many other ravages of HIV/AIDS. Local artists and galleries donate more than 350 pieces of art to the first-ever Angel Art fundraiser; generating more than \$550,000. In this short span of less than two years, a dozen clients become 200 clients.



1992-94

Project Angel Food receives its first grant from The Elizabeth Taylor AIDS Foundation for \$100,000 – the very first ETAF grant awarded – and new offices and a kitchen are established on Sunset Blvd. We are now serving more than 400 clients with the support of 13 staff members, our first government grant, and drop off centers in Pasadena, Downtown LA, and Hollywood.



1995-99

The majority of our clients are now people of color, women, and children. Project Angel Food's fleet expands to eight donor-sponsored vans. Our two millionth meal is served and Elizabeth Taylor is presented with the Angel Award. Records indicate over 20,000 people have volunteered and over 30,000 known cases of people living with HIV/AIDS in Los Angeles.



2000-01

Project Angel Food receives its second grant of \$50,000, presented to then CEO John Gile by MAC president John Demsey and Mary J. Blige from the MAC AIDS Fund which continues to support to this day. Over 2.5 million meals have been served.



2002-03

Our signature fundraiser Divine Design—which has been generating a vital stream of revenue since 1991—brings together Los Angeles's top fashion and furniture designers, and attracts silver screen stars like Adrien Brody, Selma Blair, and Sarah Michelle Gellar. Held in Santa Monica's Barker Hanger, Divine Design raises nearly \$1 million during each of these two years. Project Angel Food serves its 3 millionth meal in 2003.



2004-05

Our mission expands to include people with cancer, diabetes, renal failure, COPD and other life-threatening illnesses. We pilot a six-month Breakfast Program to provide a second meal to clients most in need. Project Angel Food serves its 4 millionth meal in 2005.



2006-08

Project Angel Food moves to 922 Vine Street in Hollywood where LA City Council President Eric Garcetti, LA City Councilmember Tom LaBonge, and Board Chair Merrily Newton commemorate our new home. The new kitchen officially opens November 15, 2017 and Mayor Antonio Villaraigosa is on hand for the ribbon cutting and to celebrate our 5 millionth meal.



2009-11

We celebrate 20 years of service to our Los Angeles community and launch the Project Angel Food Urban Garden initiative to cultivate and harvest fresh organic vegetables and fruits for our meals. Congressman Xavier Becerra (CA-31) tours the kitchen to see our life-saving work in action. Project Angel Food serves its 6 millionth meal in 2009 and 7 millionth meal in 2010.



2012-13

Project Angel Food makes impressive strides in fundraising with a Kiehl's Since 1851 partnership, the debut of our signature Feed Bead bracelets (hand-crafted by volunteers), and our delicious Do Gooding Good Cookies (available in Chocolate Chip, Iced Lemon, and Ginger Snap) hit the shelves of local supermarkets. Project Angel Food serves its 8 millionth meal in 2012.



2014-16


Project Angel Food celebrates its 25th anniversary and 9 million meals delivered. We begin delivering breakfast meals to the children and grandchildren of clients; a new program that continues to this day. Richard Ayoub joins the team as Interim Executive Director and six short months later, officially becomes the organization's new leader. Project Angel Food serves its 10 millionth meal in 2016.



2017-19

Adam Lambert performs a moving tribute to George Michael at Angel Awards 2017 in honor of his nearly three decades of support which continues to this day through his estate. Project Angel Food joins the California Food is Medicine Coalition (CalFIMC) and embarks on a collaborative effort with Assemblymembers Blanca E. Rubio and Richard Bloom, and Senators Holly Mitchell and Ben Allen to secure funding for a groundbreaking pilot program that will reduce hospital visits for Medi-Cal patients with congestive heart failure. Project Angel Food serves its 11 millionth meal in 2017.

Project Angel Food’s Board Members, Trustees, and Ambassadors are integral to guiding and realizing the organization’s programming, operations, and fundraising goals. In addition to their roles in the community as leaders in the fields of media, medicine, technology, and culture, these talented and generous individuals leverage their positions and voices to advocate for food as medicine for our vulnerable clients. They donate funds, time, relationships, and countless resources to ensure that we continue to meet the growing need in the community.



Before Joe Mannis was practicing law, before he was one of the longest-serving members of Project Angel Food’s Board of Directors, before he’d donated tens of thousands of dollars to helping us fulfill our mission, he was a social worker in Los Angeles. Joe’s experiences working directly with Angelenos who were severely disabled and unable to work laid the foundation for his commitment to philanthropy and Project Angel Food. Joe served on our Board of Directors—for the maximum consecutive term!—from November 2011 through November 2019 as Vice Chair, Board Chair, and Chair Emeritus. He has been invaluable to fundraisers such as Angel Awards and Angel Art and continues to be a compassionate advocate for our most vulnerable neighbors. Why? In his own words, “Project Angel Food is an absolutely great organization, doing absolutely important work. It is our duty to help the people who have the most need and it’s hard to imagine anyone more in need than Project Angel Food clients. They have debilitating illnesses, food insecurity, and no extended family to care for them. Project Angel Food is a lifeline for those with nowhere else to turn.”

Project Angel Food’s passionate leaders and staff invest a diverse range of talents in the oversight, management, strategic vision and direction for all of our programs. Many of our team members have been with us for at least a decade or more and they often start as volunteers.

Chef Angelique Cope has been part of the Project Angel Food family for more than 20 years. Born in Cleveland, Ohio and cycled through the foster system there, Angelique came to Los Angeles on a one-way ticket with only \$50 in her pocket. So, when she heard about Project Angel Food on the radio in 1998, her heart ached for our clients as she knew first-hand what is to be alone and in need in Los Angeles. Angelique realized she could leverage her flexible schedule as a hair stylist to benefit Project Angel Food’s clients and began delivering meals daily between noon and 2:00 p.m. In 2006 she began volunteering in the kitchen and her talent was quickly recognized by late Kitchen Manager Derbeh Vance. He entrusted her with recipes for 1,200 clients and Angelique was inspired to do more. She enrolled in the Los Angeles Trade Technical College for Professional Baking “solely to be better for the organization.” After graduating she was offered a position in Volunteer Services and a year later transitioned to working in the kitchen full time. She’s given herself the title of “Volunplovee” and “likes to think that the job found me.” She says, “The most rewarding part of each day is knowing that we came together as a team to get quality meals to our clients. I enjoy being creative in the kitchen, I’m passionate about the mission, and I’ve always had a heart for service; it just happens that food is the medium.”
