A WORD FROM OUR LEADERS

What would Los Angeles be like without Project Angel Food?

What if Marianne Williamson didn't care about providing dignity, love and comfort to people dying of AIDS?

What if thousands of Angelenos didn't care about their neighbors who were suffering?

Well, the good news is, we don't have to worry about that, because Project Angel Food has a halo of love around us making sure that we (and the 1,300 people who depend on us every day) are taken care of.

This is the 29th anniversary of Project Angel Food and 11 million meals later, we continue to serve people living with HIV. We are also delivering medically - tailored meals to clients with cancer, heart disease, lung disease and kidney failure.

These 11 million meals represent 5 generations of clients: men, women and children – from ages 20 to 108 throughout the 4,400 square miles of LA County – from Lancaster to Long Beach, Pomona to Santa Monica.

Most of our clients were living vibrant lives until one catastrophic event changed everything. They can no longer work, they are too weak to shop or cook for themselves and friends and family have stopped calling and visiting. But, they finally had the courage to ask for help.

There is no judgement, only love here.

And, for the first time ever the State of California is investing in our work. The state is funding a three year pilot program at Project Angel Food and five of our sister agencies in California to prove that our nutritious meals can indeed bring down health care costs.

Over the period of this pilot Project Angel Food will provide 100 percent nutrition to nearly 200 people living with Congestive Heart Disease (CHF) who are receiving Medi-Cal (or Medicaid). We will also send our registered dietitians to their homes to provide Medical Nutrition Therapy.

Our goal is simple: keep the patients out of the hospital longer thus saving taxpayers thousands of dollars.

It's really early, but we are already seeing promising results. One of our clients, Candice, is a huge success story. Candice is in her 30s, has several children and has scars all over her chest because she's been picked and poked by needles during her frequent hospital visits.

She told us, "I don't want to be a burden on my family anymore. I want to stay out of the hospital." So, she said, "I only eat your meals." These are meals with very low salt, but our creative dietitians and chefs replace salt with herbs and spices creating delicious recipes.

I'm happy to report that Candice has lost weight, she can breathe better now and hasn't returned to the hospital in at least 60 days! Most importantly, her quality of life has improved.

Candice is a prime example of us living up to our mission to "deliver healthy meals to feed people impacted by serious illness, bringing comfort and hope every day."

None of this work could be done without your help. On behalf of the 1,300 people who received meals today – thank you!

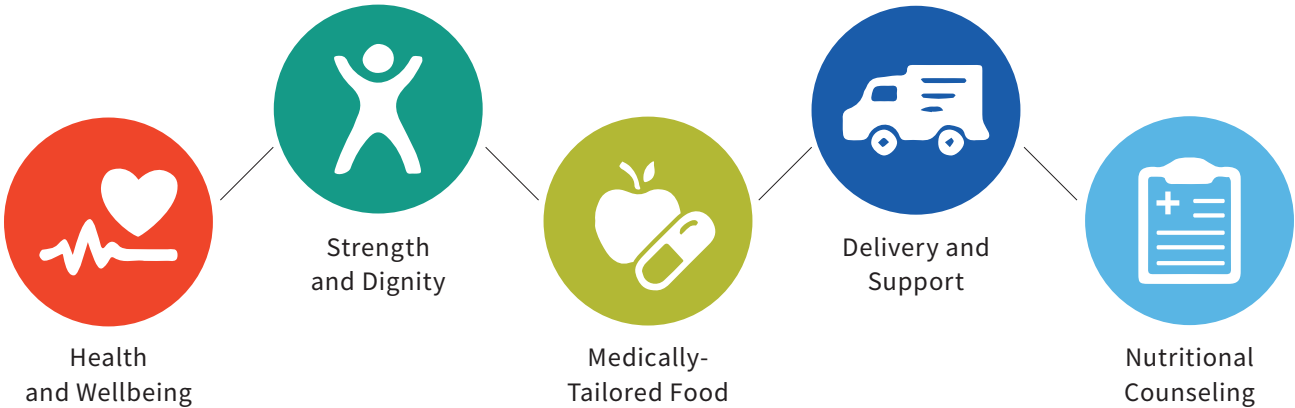

To prepare more than 11,000 medically-tailored meals each week, a passionate team of full-time chefs, interns, externs and volunteers accommodate 39 different, medically-prescribed meal plans. And we have the space to expand our kitchen three times over...that's more than 1.5 million meals a year!

HISTORIC MILESTONES

1990

Project Angel Food moves into the kitchen of the Crescent Heights United Methodist Church.

1993

Leonard Nimoy donates the first agency van, Project Angel Food obtains our first-ever government grant & staffs 13 employees.

George Michael starts a tradition of donating \$25,000 a year which continues to this day.



1999

Our 2 millionth meal is served. Records show over 20,000 people have volunteered.

2004

Our scope of work expands to serve clients struggling with all types of critical & debilitating chronic illnesses.

Project Angel Food is founded by Marianne Williamson as an outreach program of the Los Angeles Center for Living, which helps people with life-threatening illnesses.

1989

The first “Divine Design” evening brings in more than \$1,300,000. Demand for meals continues to grow.

1991

Deliveries are expanded through drop-off centers to include Pasadena, Downtown & greater Hollywood & over 100 people call for meal service each month.

1994

665 new clients enroll in our meal delivery program, 48 volunteer orientations train more than 724 new volunteers. Over 2.5 million meals have now been served.

2001

Wallis Annenberg makes a \$500,000 leadership grant & Project Angel Food expands capacity by purchasing a new state-of-the-art facility.

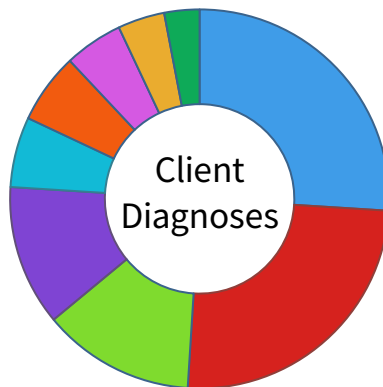

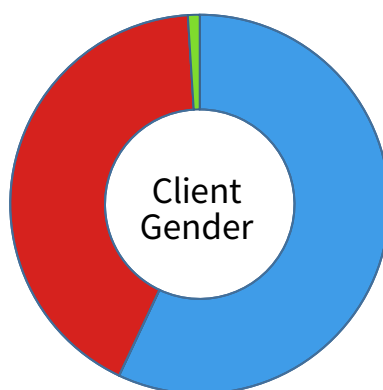
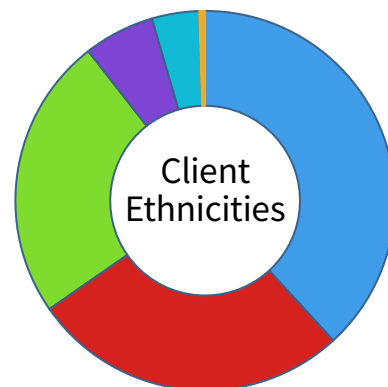
OUR CLIENTS

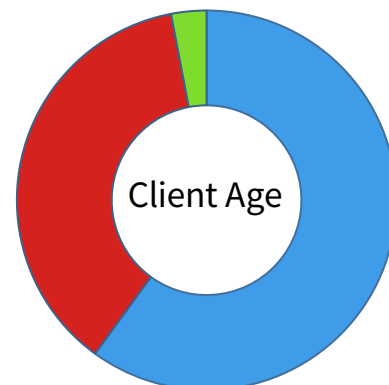

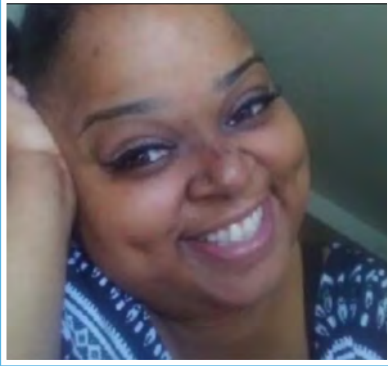
VOLUNTEERS & INTERNS

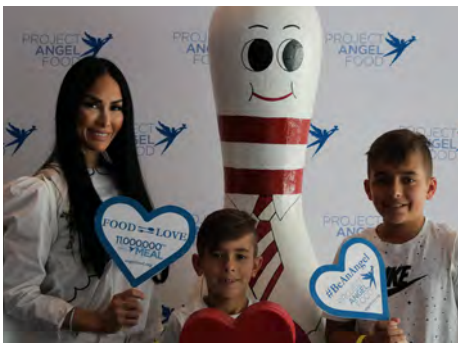

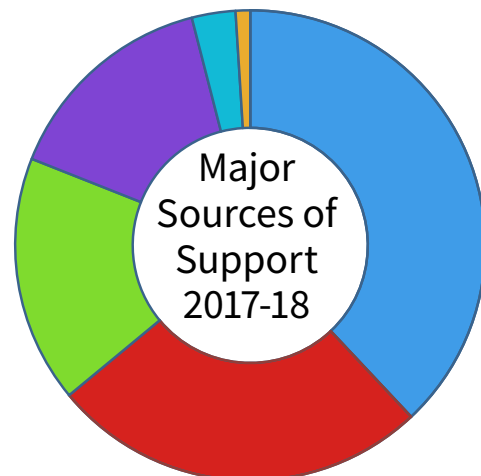

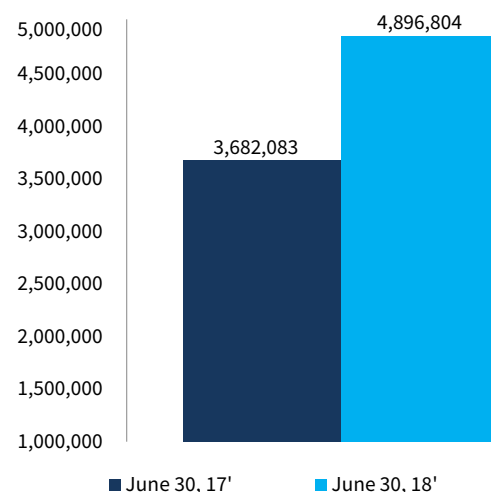
