	John Fetterman (D)	2.5	Fetterman's primary government experience is as mayor of a small town. He does have some state experience as Lieutenant Governor, but no federal government experience. His views are progressive and he has not expressed a willingness to seek balanced solutions that would be in the best interests of all citizens. He has integrity, honesty and transparency.	Fetterman has been lieutenant governor of Pennsylvania and chair of the Pennsylvania Board of Pardons since 2018. Prior to that Fetterman served for 13 years as the mayor of Braddock, a low-income steel town near Pittsburgh. Fetterman started in AmeriCorps, the federal service program, in a lower-income neighborhood of Pittsburgh. He has a masters in public policy from Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government. Unfortunately that level of anti-establishment has led to being anti-democracy and is a threat to the political and economic future of our country. Oz supports and is endorsed by Trump, who is fully anti-democracy. Oz has no government experience. He is running a negative, misleading campaign against Fetterman.	Oz rose to fame with Oprah Winfrey and his own talk show. He has long lived in New Jersey, but registered to vote in 2020 at his in-laws' Montgomery County, PA home, where he now lives. He's touting himself as a doctor who can help the country move past a failed and restrictive response to the coronavirus pandemic. Oz believes in America first, gun rights, "keeping our borders clean," fighting China, fighting Washington, fighting "far-left, liberal-woke ideology" and firing Anthony Fauci. Her experience as a US Representative, supporter of stakeholder capitalism, community development, and business leader are helpful in preparing her for a continued role as US Representative. Houlahan advocates for bipartisanship and has worked on bipartisan committees and with bipartisan groups to consider all perspectives on issues and accomplish solutions for all.	Houlahan has been US Representative for PA 6th District since 2018. She was a Founder and Chief Operating Officer of B-Lab, which supports stakeholder driven businesses. She was a chemistry teacher at Teach for America in the Simon Gratz HS Charter Schools and Mastery Charter Schools. She was the President and Chief Operating Officer of Springboard Collaborative, a teacher and family coaching firm, and Director of Distribution and Information Systems and Chief Operating Officer of AND1, a basketball shoe company. Houlahan attended the Graduate School of Urban Education, U of P, received an MS degree in Technology and Policy from MIT, and received a BS degree in Industrial Engineering from Stanford University. However he has expressed a willingness to seek balanced solutions on issues that would be in the best interests of all citizens. He has reasonable state government experience with seven years a PA Representative and six years as PA Attorney General.	Shapiro is currently Attorney General for Pennsylvania. He was elected as Attorney General in 2016 and re-elected in 2020. From 2011 to 2017 Shapiro practiced law at Stradley, Ronon, Stevens, and Young in Philadelphia and was on the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners. From 2005 to 2012 Shapiro was a representative in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives. 	Austin Davis (D) for Lieutenant Governor	2.0	At 32, Austin is young and inexperienced for this level of position in the PA government. From 2012 to 2018 Austin was aide to Allegheny County Executive Rich Fitzgerald. 	Douglas Mastriano (R) for Governor	1.0	As with many Republican candidates today, Mastriano is anti-establishment to the point of being anti-democracy and is a threat to the political and economic future of our country. Mastriano supports and is endorsed by Trump, who is fully anti-democracy. Mastriano has little government experience.	Mastriano is a retired Army colonel elected to the state Senate from a rural district in 2019. He played a leading role in efforts to overturn Trump's 2020 defeat in Pennsylvania. He called for a recount three days after the 2020 election and organized a public hearing featuring Rudy Giuliani. He attended the January 6th Stop the Steal Rally in DC. He promises to overturn 2020 Presidential election if he is elected. In PA, the Governor appoints the Secretary of State, who is the Chief Election Official. 	Carrie Lewis Delrosso (R) for Lieutenant Governor	1.0	As with many Republican candidates today, Delrosso is anti-establishment to the point of being anti-democracy and is a threat to the political and economic future of our country. Delrosso supports Mastriano and Trump, who are fully anti-democracy. Delrosso has little government or business experience.	Delrosso was first elected to the PA House of Representatives in 2020. In her campaign materials Delrosso highlights her small business owner experience as preparing her to represent small business in PA but never mentions that her small business owner experience was limited to being an independent marketing and public relations consultant for three years and an independent event planner for two years. She has run a very negative and misleading ad campaign against Florio.	Muth has been the PA Senator for District 44 since 2018. Prior to that she was an adjunct professor of kinesiology (study of body movement) at a local university, while practicing sports medicine. She received a master's degree in Athletic Training from A.T. 	Jessica Florio (R)	<b>1.5</b>	Florio has not provided sufficient information to prepare an accurate rating. The fact that she hasn't indicates a low level of honesty and transparency for a candidate for a public office. That and her lack of applicable education, meaningful political or other experience, and a very negative and misleading ad campaign against Muth has resulted in a low rating.	Florio has been a special education teacher for 15 years. She is currently a special education teacher in a charter school, but doesn't say which one. She also indicates that she has been a special education teacher for a public school, but doesn't indicate where. She has been on the Honey Brook Borough Council for nine years, eight of which as president.
