EXTRAORDINARY FUNDING FOR SPECIALIST VICTIM SERVICE PROVIDERS WELCOMED BY PCVC

The decision by the Ministry of Justice to allocate additional funding to Police and Crime Commissioners to support specialist voluntary and community organisations who support victims of domestic abuse and sexual violence has been welcomed by Acting Police, Crime and Victims' Commissioner Steve White.

Across County Durham and Darlington, an additional £400,000 of funding has been made available and so far thirteen organisations have benefited from this. These specialist organisations have faced unprecedented challenges, as they adapt and change how they deliver their vital services, during the COVID-19 Crisis.

Steve White Acting Durham Police, Crime and Victims' Commissioner said: "It is fantastic that nationally there has been an acknowledgement that our key support organisations needed additional funding to adapt in order to continue to provide their vital services. We are aware of the impact that COVID-19 has had on the victims of these crimes and their families, therefore it was a welcome surprise when we were allocated more funding than we initially anticipated. This means we can assist more organisations to adapt in order to deliver their services in this ever changing environment and therefore more victims can be supported."



Enter our Celebration of Local Superheros online competitions Competition 1 - Art Design 'Your Personal Superhero'


Whilst we can't host our annual Celebration of Local Superheroes event this year, we are bringing our event competitions online!
