MUSICAL FAMILY FUN



FAMILY DANCE PARTY

Practice your unique dance moves in a family dance party. Take turns making song selections to incorporate everyone's personal favorites. Name your new moves and take everyone's dance steps for a spin.



PERFORMING AT THE LIVING ROOM BOWL

Have a family concert and pull out some fun clothes and accessories. Play dress up in each other's clothes and use fashion to highlight your individual flair. Transform your performance into your own version of the Birdie Bowl and put on a concert using paper towel rolls or spoons as microphones.



HIDE AND GO SEEK MY VOICE

Play your own version of Hide and Go Seek My Voice at home. Invite the hiders to hide very well and then use their voices to sing at different pitches, high or low, to try to indicate where they are. The seeker will follow the sounds of the voices they hear to try to find everyone.



THIS IS ME!

This is a fun classic activity that helps your child learn parts of the body. Get out a large piece of paper (or tape paper together) that is the size of your child. Have your child lay on the paper and trace around their body. Next, talk about the parts of the body as your child fills in the outline. Where is your heart? What does it do? Expand the fun by highlighting on the image - what makes your child special...talents, how they are kind, etc.



THE ANIMAL SOUND GUESSING GAME

Animal noises are produced at different pitches and volumes. Think about the high squeak of a mouse and the low growl of a lion. Before getting started, talk about how all animals really sound so different. Then take turns changing your voices to make animal noises so that the others can quess what animals they are.
