## Crop insured

All commercially grown olives are insurable if:

- ✓ They are grown for table or oil production, with at least four years of production records;
- ✓ They are irrigated; and
- ✓ They have met either the minimum age or production requirement.

## Causes of loss

You are protected against the following:

- ✓ Adverse weather;
- ✓ Earthquake;
- ✓ Failure of irrigation water supply;
- ✓ Fire;
- ✓ Insect damage and/or plant disease, unless you have insufficiently or improperly applied pest or disease control measures;
- ✓ Volcanic eruption; or
- ✓ Wildlife.

## Coverage levels and premium subsidies

Coverage levels range from 50 to 75 percent of your approved yield. Crop insurance premiums are subsidized as shown in the following table. For example, if you choose the 65 percent coverage level, your premium share would be 41 percent of the base premium.

Item	Percent					
Coverage Level	50	55	60	65	70	75
Premium Subsidy	67	64	64	59	59	55

## INSURANCE PERIOD

Coverage is sold in two-year modules; you must remain in the program for at least two consecutive years. You must apply for coverage with a crop insurance agent before January 31 to insure the crop you plan to harvest in that year and the following year.

Catastrophic Risk Protection (CAT) coverage is fixed at 50 percent of your approved yield and 55 percent of the price election. CAT is 100-percent subsidized with no premium cost to you. There is, however, an administrative fee of \$300 per crop per county, regardless of the acreage.

## COUNTIES AVAILABLE

Insurance is available in Tulare, Tehama, Glenn, Madera, Fresno, Butte, Kern, San Joaquin, Shasta, Stanislaus, and Colusa counties for table olives; and in Tulare, Tehama, Glenn, Madera, Fresno, Butte, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, Colusa, Yolo, and Sutter counties for oil olives.
