- a. The Executive Board, comprised of Mr. Gerard Gwinn (President), Mr. Joey Gagnon (1st Vice-President), Mr. John Tufarella (2nd Vice President), and Ms. Danielle L. Vios (Recording Secretary) is PRESENT. Mr. Franky Garay (Secretary Treasurer) is not present.

This money is earmarked for the Welfare Fund as "Reserves" which will enable us to keep afloat for (22) months without contribution if something were to happen

5. SICK LEAVE BANK

- a. The Sick Leave Bank balance is 65,185 hours
- b. So far in 2022, we have granted 841:35hrs to five (5) Members

- c. We have had no contributions from the members in (5) years but may be looking to bring back contributions in 2022
- d. Annual contributions to sustain the SLB from Active Employees is 3.5hrs of SL. New Employees initial contribution is 21hrs of SL, New Employee Transfers from another unit will have an initial contribution of 14hrs, and if one has declined to participate and seeks membership to the SLB they will be required to contribute SL equal to the level of contributions they would have made had s/he joined the SLB when originally eligible and will not be eligible for grants for the first SIX months.

6. **DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS**

a. We currently have 9 pending up from 5

7. GRIEVANCES

- a. <u>5/22/2019</u> The SLED Grievance with NYSCOA & COBANC regarding the Officers that did not receive the SLED money had been worked out but will now be attached to contract during negotiations.
- b. <u>8/11/2020</u> Grievance for the use of Weekly Schedules during COVID instead of sticking to the 4 Week Term Schedules by changing the Term Schedules and using a Weekly Schedule they are "Changing Shifts" to save/reduce over time. This is at Step 2 waiting for decision. We have made several requests for a decision and a have still not received anything as of today.
- c. <u>8/26/2021</u> <u>Contractual Grievance Vaccination Mandate</u> Pursuant to Article 35 Conclusion Of Collective Negotiations of our CBA where it states "During the term of this Agreement, neither party will unilaterally seek to modify its terms through legislation or any other means." OCA is in direct violation by modifying the terms and conditions of employment. Also, in violation of Article 38 Conflict With Agreement where it states "Where the Rules of the Chief Judge and Chief Administrative Judge and the Agreement conflict, the provisions of this agreement shall prevail." This is tied up in PERB and will be discussed during negotiations.
 - **The Improper Practice charge is still pending in P.E.R.B.
- d. <u>9/13/2021</u> Prior/Past Practice Grievance Lieutenant from the Mags is no longer allowed to cover the late shift if the 9-5 Lieutenant in District Court is out in order to avoid paying the Over Time. This is at Step 2.

- e. <u>10/22/2021</u> Central Jury Worker who is working UP out of title. This is currently at Step 1.
- f. <u>1/21/22</u> Return Firearm Privileges This is at Step 2.
- g. <u>1/21/22</u> Return Personal Handgun Privileges This is at Step 2.
- h. <u>2/22/22</u> Filed Incapacitated Grievance to allow people who were forced out of worked and deemed "UNFIT" by OCA to use their Sick Leave This is currently at Step 2.

8. UPGRADES

- a. Nothing new to report at this time.
- b. We will address ALL Upgrades at the time of negotiations

9. LEGISLATION

a. 1st Vice President Joey Gagnon spoke briefly about the PEC Breakfast he and 2nd Vice President John Tufarella attended in Albany. All of the speakers addressed Tier 6 and the need to address the problems with it. Changes have been made, the vested time has been dialed back to five (5) years from ten (10) years for Tier 5 and Tier 6 employees. The reform also waives the portion of contributions of Tier 6 employee pensions making it based on base salary not on additional overtime worked.

Hopefully those are not the only amendments made this year.

10. OTHER BUSINESS

- a. **BY-LAWS VOTE** There was a unanimous vote in favor of the update to the SCCEA Constitution /By-Laws. They have been posted to the website.
- b. <u>PERB Hearing was 4/05/2022</u> The hearing continued for four (4) days. It concluded on 4/14 and we are expecting and expedited decision sometime around September or October.
- c. <u>Contract Negotiations</u> Proposed date is May 25th
 - ALL Judicial Unions vowed to stick together on all universal matters in negotiations. We are looking to build everywhere we can: Location Pay, Bonuses, SLED, Uniform Allowance, etc....
- d. <u>COVID-19</u> COVID numbers seem to be on a slight incline again. Suffolk County is now in what they are calling a "Yellow Zone". NYS Courts still has a Mask Mandate. Please be mindful and respectful of that.
