Public Policy

CalDesal is a part of California's legislative and regulatory landscape and continuously engages in and helps influence policy today. We helped shape the State Water Board's Ocean Plan Amendment and provided input to the Governor's Water Resiliency Portfolio which includes desalination as part of the state's larger water supply solution. CalDesal also testifies in support of members' desalination projects at the state and local government levels.



Collaboration

CalDesal networks with water entities to efficiently elevate desal including California Urban Water Agencies, California and national WateReuse, and the American Membrane Technology Association. Here is an example of CalDesal collaborating with CUWA supporting alternative water supplies.
