





## Why VSware?

## We asked the school why they chose VSware

Gaelcholáiste Luimnigh decided to change it's Management Information System (MIS) provider in March 2014. 

## **Teacher engagement**

The principal was astounded with an adoption rate of 100% amongst staff to record attendance on the system for every single class period. This was not the case with the previous system used in the school, as it took far too long to take the roll. He explained: 'teacher training in the daily use of VSware was completely hasslefree. ## Flexible reporting



The principal believes that the ultimate benefit of using VSware is the amount of data school management can view in the Dashboard, which provides vital snapshots of the school's activity which school leaders can scan through during the day, whether in school or at a meeting outside of school. #### Real-time data


