## Overview – carers in the UK/England

- 10.6 million (Carers UK 2022 polling)
- 12,000 become unpaid carers a day (Petrillo, M, Bennett M, Pryce, G, Nov 2022)
- Majority working age

#### **Unpaid carers' priorities**

- Health and wellbeing
- Recognition identification and respect!
- Right support to be able to care
- Support for person cared for

## Healthcare policies and strategies

- NHS Constitution: carer involvement
- NHS bodies must have regard to above
- New NHS Trusts (hospitals) duty to involve unpaid carers at hospital discharge since 2022
- New NHS regional bodies of Trusts and others (Integrated Care Boards) –
  - Duty to involve carers in plans/services
  - Duty to involve carers when making decisions about patient's diagnosis treatment or care

Health legislative architecture is getting better.....



# Healthcare policies and strategies

- NHS bodies have a duty to promote health and wellbeing
- Joint health and social care (local authority) duty to reduce health inequalities
- Caring recognised as social determinant of health by government public health body
- Care Act 2014 (local authorities) duty to promote wellbeing including family caregivers
- Parity of esteem treated equally in law.

What are the drivers of change?



## **Drivers of change?**

- Policies
- Data drives change e.g. NHS Staff Survey found 1 in 3 workers were unpaid carers
- Financial incentives
- Monitoring
- Active and engaged voluntary sector
- Active and engaged carers
- Strong carer identification and linked data/use

Does this deliver outcomes?



## **Questions to ask**

- Do employers identify staff who are unpaid carers?
- Is research evidence being used to drive practice?
- Are there incentives and can help drive change rather than just persuasion?
- Are there strong links to local organisations who can support?

Importantly, are we giving family caregivers a choice?
