The letter has been included in this edition.

Interestingly, Dargov, as it has been known since 1964, has had numerous name changes. My source, www.cisarik.com lists the names as Dargó, then Dargow, and in 1863 until 1913 back to Dargó. Then 1920 to 1948 it was known as Dargov, before becoming Drahov until 1964 when it once again became Dargó. The reported population is 600+. Anyhow it may be sometime before I hear back, if at all, fingers crossed I do as it is something that could become an interesting milestone.

I have had two people take advantage of my assisting them with an application for the \$250 Power Saving Bonus Outreach Program. I have left the advertisement in this edition so as to remind those who qualify, to come on down to the DNH and I am more than happy to assist with their application. Dear Štefánia

I hope this letter finds you, your family and your community in good health.

Please let me introduce myself.

My name is Mick Eccles and I live in the state of Victoria [Australia] in a small town called Dargo. I have recently become the Manager of my town's community centre known as a 'Dargo Neighbourhood House'.

In Australia, Neighbourhood Houses aim to be the heart of the townships communities in an effort to bring people together to connect, learn and contribute to their local community through social, educational, recreational and support activities.

My letter is aimed to make contact with you in an effort to encourage our communities to engage by email or letter and share stories of our different cultures and lifestyles.

Every two weeks I publish a 'Dargo Bush Bulletin' which is a community based newspaper that provides an update of events which have recently occurred in and around Dargo. I have included two copies to illustrate the content of the 'Bulletin'.

The township of Dargo which I live in, is a small town of a little over 100 residents. It is located in the central highlands of Victoria and its past history was that the town used to be a stopover for miners making their way to the Australian goldfields.

Today, the area is known for being a producer of timber and beef cattle. The town is a popular destination for four-wheel drive enthusiasts, motor bike riders, bushwalkers, deer hunters and trout fisherman.

Over the years, Dargo has become a very popular area for tourism.

The town has two hotels, a motel, a general store, a museum, a Bush Nursing Centre, a fire brigade, a Landcare group and a Victorian government department which manages the environment, land, water and planning [DELWP].

The average age of residents in Dargo is approximately 63 years of age.

I have researched and noticed that Dargov used to be known as Dargó up until 1913 and became Dargov again in 1964.

Noting the similarity of both our townships names is what has drawn me to contact you; to identify if there would be an interest within your community to make contact with residents of my community.

There are residents here in Dargo who are interested in sharing communications with residents of your community. The method of communication we can discuss further if you believe communications between both our communities would be an interesting thing to do.

Interestingly enough, there is another township named Dargo. It is located in the African country, Burkina Faso, and I may attempt to engage that community at some point in the future.

But first of all, I would like to communicate with you and attempt to build a friendship between our two communities.

Thank you for taking the time to read my letter. I look forward to hearing from you.



Power Saving Bonus Outreach Program

As I mentioned in my 'Introduction', the below information is the Victorian Governments initiative and I encourage those <u>who meet the criteria</u> to contact me and I will happily assist with the online application.

Closing date for the Power Saving Bonus is 30th June 2022.



Neighbourhood Houses Victoria and Good Shepherd have partnered to help eligible community members apply for the State Government's \$250 Power Saving Bonus.

This one-off \$250 payment is designed to help ease the cost of living for eligible Victorian households during the pandemic.

Applications for the Power Saving Bonus are made online, however we understand that many people in our communities either lack access to devices or internet, or lack confidence and skills in using technology.

To ensure no one gets left behind, neighbourhood houses across the state are ready to help people complete their Power Saving Bonus application.

What is the \$250 Power Saving Bonus?

The \$250 Power Saving Bonus is a one-off \$250 payment which provides direct support to Victorian households experiencing power bill stress during the coronavirus pandemic.

It is available to over 900,000 eligible Victorian households with at least one eligible concession cardholder.

Who is eligible for the Power Saving Bonus?

To be eligible, you must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- Be a Victorian residential energy consumer (i.e. have a residential electricity account)
- Be receiving payments under one of the following concession programs:
- Centrelink Pensioner Concession
- JobSeeker, Youth Allowance, Austudy or Abstudy
- Department of Veterans Affairs Pensioner Concession
- Or hold a Department of Veterans Affairs Gold Card

Holders of Health Care Cards who are not recipients of Youth Allowance, JobSeeker, Austudy or Abstudy are not eligible.

When can eligible households apply?

Eligible households can apply anytime now up until 30 June 2022.

How many people per household can apply?

Only one payment is available to each household.

How do I apply for the bonus?

Applications are made online. If you do not have access to, or are uncomfortable using technology, get in contact with one of our <u>Power Saving Bonus Outreach Providers</u>.

What do I need for the application process?

When you come to us to submit your application, there are a few things you need to bring with you:

- A copy of a recent electricity bill
- Your 'NMI' number (this is located on your bill and is typically a 10 or 11 digit number)
- Your card number for your Pensioner Concession Card or Health Care Card (for JobSeekers, Youth Allowance, Austudy and Abstudy recipients)

Be sure to keep a copy of your NMI and your application reference number as you may need this information for further communications about your application.

How long does it take to receive the Power Saving Bonus?

If you meet the eligibility and documentation requirements, you should receive your \$250 payment via Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT) within two to three weeks of submission. If you request payment via cheque, this should be received within four weeks.





CHIMNEY CHECK IS CRUCIAL FOR WINTER SAFETY

CFA is urging residents to keep themselves safe by checking and maintaining their fireplaces, chimneys, fireboxes and flues.

Firefighters respond to numerous chimney fires every year that start from fireplaces and wood heaters.

In 2021, CFA firefighters responded to 130 chimney fires, almost half of which occurred during the winter months.

CFA Chief Officer Jason Heffernan urged Victorian households to have chimneys professionally cleaned annually to avoid the build-up of creosote – a highly flammable black tar-like residue – that could clog chimneys.

"Winter is the perfect time to curl up in front of a warm fire, but chimney fires can quickly turn into house fires," CO Heffeman said.

"Spending a few minutes now to check your chimney could be one of the most important fire safety actions you take this season, and you can easily check for creosote build-up or obstructions by simply using a torch before lighting a fire.

"Creosote is caused by general use but can also build up faster if you are using incorrect fuels such as green wood or treated timbers, so make sure you only burn dry, clean wood to reduce the risk of fire starting from a fireplace or wood heater."

"We also urge everyone to always extinguish their fire before going to bed or leaving the house."

CO Heffernan said it is also important to ensure gas heaters are being used safely and correctly, and urged Victorians to have their gas heaters inspected and serviced by a qualified technician every two years to avoid a fire or carbon monoxide poisoning.

"The colder months are some of the riskiest times of the year for fires in the home, and most of these fires can be prevented," he said.

"Taking a few moments to check your heaters and fireplaces before winter sets in could mean the difference between life and death for your family.

"It's important to remember that no matter the season, having interconnected smoke alarms in all bedrooms and living areas can provide vital seconds to allow you and your family to escape in case of a fire," he said.


Chimney and heating tips

- Have chimneys cleaned annually and gas heaters inspected and serviced every two vears.
- A secure guard or fireproof screen should always be used to prevent sparks and wood from falling out of the fireplace and causing a fire or burn injury.

- Never dry clothes or have flammable items such as curtains close to a heater or open fire – make sure they are positioned at least one metre away and constantly monitored to reduce risk of a fire.
- Children and pets must be supervised near all types of heating. Maintain a safe distance between children and heating.
- Always extinguish any open flames, and turn off heaters before going to bed or leaving the house.


There will be a BBQ on completion. Look forward to a good turn out.







