TO REX CANDY on receiving a Meritorious Award in the Australia Day 2024 Honours List.

**From his citation:** Rex has been a leader in innovative river management and has been recognised for 25 years making East Gippsland's rivers healthier and its communities more resilient.

The East Gippsland Catchment Management Authority (CMA) congratulates long-time employee Rex Candy for being awarded the Public Service Medal in the Australia Day 2024 Honours List (Meritorious Awards) for his contributions to waterway management. Rex has led the change in waterway management practices during his career with the East Gippsland CMA.

He has strongly advocated for a new approach to river restoration and has been instrumental in a change that has made our rivers healthier.

This has included flood and bushfire recovery, providing technical assessments on flood behaviour, and leading the stabilisation of rivers across the state.

#### From our roving reporter in Antarctica:

Peter Caithness from Valencia Creek has been selected to work in Antarctica for the next twelve months.

I have now met all of the other expeditioners going to stay with me at Mawson Station (there are 21 of us) and so far they seem like a great group. So for now we have the last few weeks of training. Over the last two months, apart from our technical training ( Radio Communications, Satellite Comms, Radar Systems,

Locator beacons, Printers etc.) we have completed fire training, training in monitoring changes to the earth's magnetic fields, training in monitoring the atmosphere for radiation as part of the International Treaty monitoring the use of Nuclear weapons, introductions to Antarctic weather and survival, medical briefings, had our teeth checked and any dentistry required completed. The roles of the 21 people heading to Mawson Station with me are as follows: Station Leader (1), Station Chef (1), Station Supply Officer (1), Doctor (1), Field Training Officer (1), Trades Supervisor (1), Communication Technicians (2), Electricians (3), Plumbers (3), Carpenters (3), Mechanics (2), Bureau of Meteorology Staff (2).

ANARE is Australian National Antarctic Research Expedition. Mawson Station was established in 1954 and is the longest continuously operating station south of the Antarctic Circle. It is Australia's most westerly continental station (the other two being Davis and Casey Stations) and is situated about 5200km south west of Perth. Mawson Time is 5 hours behind Australian Eastern Standard Time.



The Bushy Park Cairn Group, part of the B&DHG congratulate Rob Christie on the publication of his book:

A Convenient Scapegoat - Angus McMillan and the Gippsland massacres.



Was Angus McMillan really the 'Butcher of Gippsland' or was he just the fall guy, a convenient scapegoat whose name has become unjustly associated with a dark time in Gippsland's history? In his book Rob Christie has meticulously researched and verified evidence that doesn't exonerate McMillan entirely but proves that he was not the leader

and instigator of the atrocities suffered by the Indigenous populations of Gippsland.

The book explores further evidence and delves deeper into the background of McMillan's place in the history of our region. He shows that the McMillan monuments are an important part of Gippsland history, that he was one of many responsible for the demise of Gippsland's Indigenous people, involved in the notorious massacres, but not deserving of the title of mass murderer. **OWLET NIGHTJAR.** 



The Australian Owlet-nightjar is the smallest of the nocturnal birds (night birds) found in Australia.

Its large brown eyes are non-reflective when exposed to a torch or spotlight (other nocturnal birds give a red reflection). The Owlet-nightjar has two different plumage colourations: russet-brown (rufous), and the more common grey. In both forms the birds are paler below and are faintly barred with black. There are two wide black stripes that extend over the head from the top of the eyes and meet on the back of the neck.

The rufous form is restricted to the female birds, which, even in the grey form, tend to be more rufous-tinged than the males. The young resemble adults but have less distinct black markings.

The Australian Owlet-nightjar is one of the most common and widespread of Australia's nocturnal birds. It occurs throughout Australia and its islands, as well as southern New Guinea.

The preferred habitat is almost any tree-studded area where there are suitable hollows, although open areas are also visited. During the day it roosts in hollow branches and tree trunks. The birds form permanent bonds, and pairs occupy the same territory throughout the year.

They feed at night on a variety of insects. Birds will readily take flying prey or will pounce on prey either on the ground or in trees. Hunting takes place within a territory and normally in pairs. They watch for food while in flight, or by sitting and searching from a suitable

perch. They raise one brood per season. Both sexes construct the nest, which is a bed of green leaves, placed in a suitable tree hollow or rock crevice. Both birds also incubate the eggs and care for the chicks.

## ONWARD-UPWARD

#### **Boisdale Consolidated School**

A positive start to the school year for BCS with 206 students enrolled, ten classes and

two new teachers commencing at the school.

The school indoor swimming pool is operational once again and years 3-6 students have started their swimming program this week. The school swimming carnival was held on Friday 23rd February.



The school canteen continues with the healthy snacks and lunch options on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.

As referred to in the Boisdale & District History Group report inspections have been carried out on the 'infant

school' (formerly the Boisdale State School building) which is where prep support and the playgroup are held.



Following a heavy downpour some of the flooring had to be removed and some extensive termite damage was discovered. There were no active termites and there had been previous repairs to some

beams, so the department sent engineers out in January to access the structural integrity of the building. The damage extends to door jambs, windows and weatherboards.

Their report recommendations state:

- · Restrict access to whole classroom.
- Engage a licensed pest controller to remove/eradicate all live termites and termite nests if not already done.

#### Short term recommendations (1 to 2 months):

- Engage a registered builder to remove the floorboards to the remainder of the room to determine the full extent of termite damage.
- Once the full extent of damage has been determined, the builder is to install new H2S treated floor joists of the same size as the existing and in accordance with the timber framing code.

This will be an expensive undertaking, so we are looking at avenues to assist with funding for the repairs and also with the painting of the building.

The Community Playgroup is very popular and brings in many families from a range of areas. It is also valuable as it promotes future enrolments for the school, so we do need to address the building repair issue. We will keep the community updated.
