Tip #1: Change is necessary

(but doesn't have to be drastic)

What has changed?

How you're delivering

Not everything in your original class translates well to virtual.

Dynamics

You're no longer center-stage

But you still have to command attention and maintain control of class

How can you do that virtually?

Frequent breaks

Strategic activities

Slide design



Tip #2: Variety is key

- 1. Activities
- 2. Slide Design



Vary your activities

Try something new; be adventurous and willing to experiment.

Explore the possibilities: What can you do now that you couldn't do before?

→ What will help the learners intake, process, and apply the information?

Caution: It's better to facilitate two activities really well than to do six different ones poorly.

Ditch bullet points



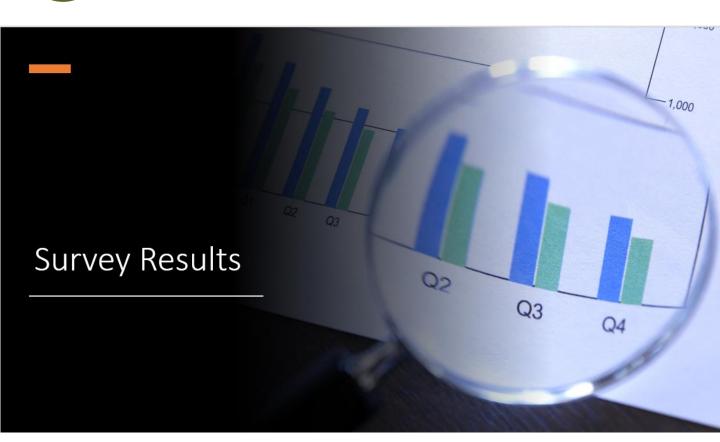
Use a cohesive color scheme



Make your headlines work harder

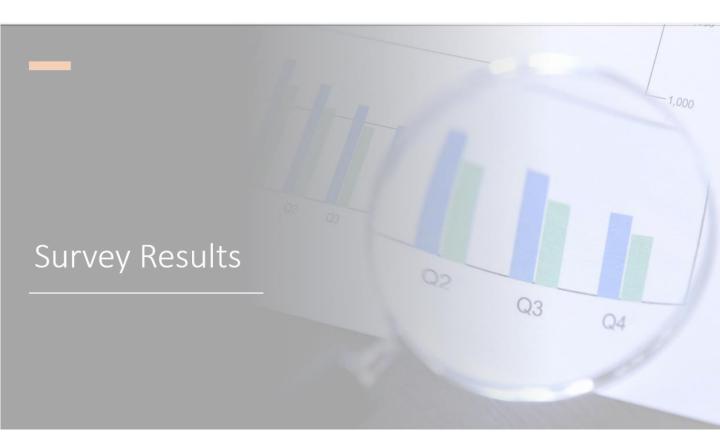

Tip #3: Community propels your class



How can I build community in a half-day class or one-hour webinar?

Address learners by name

Ask about their experiences

Acknowledge their comments



Psychological safety

Learners want to feel safe asking questions and taking risks

Give learners a choice

- •Whether to respond
- •How to respond

Freely give applause and feedback

Be clear about what you're asking
