
Annual Report - Fiscal Year 2022


Catholic Charities of Southern Nevada (CCSN) is one of the largest nonprofit social service providers in the state, offering a comprehensive range of human services. CCSN's services include 16 diverse programs designed to give help, hope, and transform the lives of some of the most vulnerable men, women, and children in our Southern Nevada community regardless of race, religion or creed.

Starting Over In Her New Home

Alex arrived in Las Vegas over two years ago to seek refuge from a life-threatening situation. Unsure of how she would eat, Alex searched for food resources on Nevada 211's website and found the Hands of Hope Community Food Pantry. Since Alex's income is too high to receive Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits, she is grateful that she qualifies to receive food from the Food Pantry to help her adjust in her new home. The Food Pantry staff welcomed and "...became my family," said Alex. "They made sure I'm okay." Now, she recommends the services Catholic Charities offers to people whom she meets who are in need, especially for those "who want to get off the street."

FOOD SERVICES

Meals on Wheels & Senior Nutrition delivered more than 856,495 meals to 4,814 homebound **seniors**, and offered modified meals or supplements to clients who required additional nutritional support.

St. Vincent Lied Dining Facility

served a balanced meal to an average of 291 people every day of the year free of charge. In addition to the daily meal service, 9 festive celebratory feasts were served throughout the year to those in need.

The Hands of Hope Community Food Pantry offered grocery items for clients throughout the fiscal year. More than **2.1 million pounds** of food were given out to 29,256 people in need.

HOMELESS & HOUSING (RESIDENTIAL) SERVICES

The Emergency Night Shelter provided 139,628 men **experiencing homeless** with a place to sleep and access to toiletries, towels, restroom and shower facilities. The Renewing HOPE Program helped 177 men transition from homelessness to self-sufficiency. The St. Vincent Apartments provided low-income housing to 128 men and women.

FAMILY SERVICES

Social Services provided assistance to help prevent temporary hardship from becoming a long-term crisis for families and individuals. During this fiscal year, 6,488 vulnerable people were helped through the Client Services office.

Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program

facilitated **45,538 visits** at two WIC offices, in person and remotely, providing mothers, fathers and children with supplemental food and nutritional education.

MIGRATION AND IMMIGRATION SERVICES

Migration and Refugee Services

assisted **2,394 people** in Nevada, who were seeking refuge or asylum from persecution around the globe. CCSN is recognized on the federal level as the State Refugee Office in Nevada. In addition to this, our agency is one of three local agencies to carry out resettlement services in the state. CCSN provides case management, employment services, cultural orientation and training classes to each client to help them assimilate to U.S. culture and eventually become U.S. citizens. **CCSN Adult Education Services** provided English Language, Citizenship and High School Equivalency classes for **802 students** with **48,284 hours of instruction** in our classrooms and remotely.

Immigration Services

provided low cost legal assistance and counseling to **1,756 immigrants**, helping them secure benefits such as naturalization, employment authorization and lawful permanent residence.

FACILITIES MAINTENANCE AND HOUSEKEEPING

Team members managed the facilities' repairs, cleanliness and program operational needs of our eight-acre campus.

LOVING HEARTS ADOPTION SERVICES

Loving Hearts Adoption Services placed **9** children in caring homes. The program provided services to **28** expectant parents or birth families and **34** hopeful adoptive families. Loving Hearts facilitated services for all areas related to adoption and provided life-long, comprehensive services for adoption triad members.

CATHOLIC CHARITIES TEAM MEMBERS

During the fiscal year of 2022, **248** dedicated full-and part-time employees carried out the mission of Catholic Charities of Southern Nevada.

SPECIAL EVENTS

During the 2022 fiscal year, CCSN brought holiday joy and support to the families served throughout its numerous programs. In November, CCSN gave out Thanksgiving turkeys and seasonal items to **3,257** families, over **3,344** Christmas toys and gift cards to children and provided **300** Easter Baskets to families in need.

THANK YOU, VOLUNTEERS!

We are appreciative for the hundreds of volunteers who dedicated their time and talents to our mission. In 2022, **11,017 hours** of service were provided by **1,342** volunteers across **9** different volunteer opportunities. These included serving in the daily Community Meal and Food Pantry, tutoring in the virtual English Language Classroom, and volunteering remotely building hygiene and baby kits to benefit Catholic Charities clients.
