

Dear supporters and friends:

This past holiday season was unprecedented for us, in our ability to serve and reach more of our vulnerable community than ever before, thanks to your generosity. With your help, our team provided more than 3,300 turkeys, and accompanying Thanksgiving meal items to low-income families; we shared 2,700 toys, gifts and warm coats to needy families for Christmas. Our dining facility served more than 1,350 meals for Thanksgiving and Christmas in our free Community Meal, in addition to regular meal service every day of the year. None of these wonderful resources would be possible without your generous support, prayers and concern for those we serve always with dignity and compassion.

As you will see in the enclosed newsletter, the agency continues to grow, providing life-saving and transforming resources to our growing community. As all of us are affected by inflation and price to some degree, those that we serve find these increases to be barriers to food security. Likewise, those on the edge of homeless-

ness and poverty are suffering more than ever. Stewardship and efficiency is important to our agency, and we take our accountabilities very seriously for your dollars to work as hard as they can, for those in greatest need.



Building a Sustainable Future

Catholic Charities began our campus renovation in 2021 to invest in the physical infrastructure to support and sustain the next generation of need and enhance services for the valley's ever-growing population. We have completed renovation of the St. Vincent Lied Dining Facility, Emergency Men's Shelter, Migration & Refugee Services building, and are in progress with our Food Services Warehouse expansion. This 10,000 sq foot space adds cold and dry storage capacity, helping us increase efficiency and prepare for us to ramp up Meals on Wheels production to serve additional seniors from the waitlist.





Meals on Wheels & Senior Nutrition delivered more than 807,156 meals to 5,206 homebound seniors, and offered modified meals or supplements to clients who required additional nutritional support.

> St. Vincent Lied Dining Facility served a balanced meal to an average of 347 people every day of the year free of charge. In addition to the daily meal service, **27,800** low cost breakfast meals and 12 festive celebratory feasts were served throughout the year to those in need.

The Hands of Hope Community Food Pantry offered grocery items for clients throughout the fiscal year. More than 2.2 million pounds of food were given out to 47,082 people in need.

HOMELESS & HOUSING (RESIDENTIAL) SERVICES

The **Emergency Night Shelter** provided 145,933 beds to men **experiencing homeless** with a place to sleep and access to toiletries, towels, restroom and shower facilities along with other resources. The Renewing HOPE Program helped **212 men** transition from homelessness to self-sufficiency. The St. Vincent Apartments provided low-income housing to **132 men and women**. The **Housing Navigation Center** helped 1,439 individuals address the challenges they faced to secure housing.

FAMILY SERVICES

Social Services provided assistance to help prevent temporary hardship from becoming a long-term crisis for families and individuals. During this fiscal year, **6,883 vulnerable people** were helped through the Client Services office.

Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program facilitated **45,427 visits** at two WIC offices, in person and remotely, providing mothers, fathers and children with supplemental food and nutritional education.

MIGRATION AND IMMIGRATION SERVICES

Migration and Refugee Services

assisted **5,700 people** in Nevada, who were seeking refuge or asylum from persecution around the globe. CCSN is recognized on the federal level as the State Refugee Office in Nevada. In addition to this, our agency is one of three local agencies to carry out resettlement services in the state. CCSN provides case management, employment services, cultural orientation and training classes to each client to help them assimilate to U.S. culture and eventually become U.S. citizens.

CCSN Adult Education Services

provided English Language, Citizenship and High School Equivalency classes for **1,473 students** with 116.658 hours of instruction in our classrooms and remotely.

Immigration Services

provided low cost legal assistance and counseling to **1,424 immigrants**, helping them secure benefits such as naturalization, employment authorization and lawful permanent residence. Family Services

FACILITIES MAINTENANCE AND HOUSEKEEPING

Team members managed the facilities' repairs, cleanliness and program operational needs of our eight-acre campus.

LOVING HEARTS ADOPTION SERVICES

Loving Hearts Adoption Services placed **9** children in caring homes. The program provided services to 16 expectant parents and birth families and 32 hopeful adoptive families. Loving Hearts facilitated services for all areas related to adoption and provides life-long, comprehensive services for adoption triad members.

CATHOLIC CHARITIES TEAM MEMBERS

During the fiscal year of 2023, **272** dedicated full-and part-time employees carried out the mission of Catholic Charities of Southern Nevada.

SPECIAL EVENTS

During the 2023 fiscal year, CCSN brought holiday joy and support to the families served throughout its numerous programs. In November, CCSN gave out Thanksgiving turkeys and seasonal items to 3,375 families, 2,703 Christmas toys and 686 gift cards to children and provided **720** Easter Baskets to families in need.


