How to Register

Interested students are required to meet with their school guidance counsellor to assure they meet the primary requirements. Students will need to submit a dual credit permission form along with paper summer school registration form. Note seats are limited and courses are subject to sufficient enrollment to run.

Registration runs from April 2 until June 3, 2024.

Late registration will open June 26, 27, 28 (4-7pm) and July 2.
