2050 Idaho Food System Vision Moves Forward

Sun Valley Institute advances to semi-finalist round in Rockefeller Food Vision Prize

- Sun Valley Institute named to semi-finalist round in Rockefeller Foundation Food Vision Prize
- SVI proposal envisions: "A food system that regenerates natural resources, the resilience of all plants and animals, and communities throughout our region."
- SVI has six weeks to refine vision and resubmit for the final round.

Ketchum, Idaho -- Sun Valley Institute is thrilled to announce that its SVI 2050 Food Vision proposal to the Rockefeller Foundation Food System Vision Prize was accepted into the semifinal round. The goal of the Prize is to envision regenerative and nourishing food futures for the year 2050. The SVI Food Vision looks at creating a resilient, regionalized food system that will uplift rural communities throughout Southern Idaho, while providing quality jobs and biodiverse nutrient-dense food to all residents and visitors alike.

Out of 1,319 visions submitted, just 79 were selected to go into the refinement period. Judges chose visions that showed great promise, are aligned with the values of renewability, resilience, equity, diversity, healthfulness, and interconnectedness, and received the highest marks on evaluation criteria: systems-focused, transformative potential, community informed and inspired.

The refinement phase asks the team to deepen its collaboration with diverse stakeholders, create a narrative showing a "day in the life" of a food system stakeholder, and further identify key opportunities in the realms of technology, policy, economy, environment, culture, and diet.
