The Sun Valley Institute for Resilience announces the hiring of Nate Twichell as Executive Director to guide the organization forward to ensure that our community, economy, and ecosystems thrive.

Nate joined the Sun Valley Institute for Resilience team as Deputy Director in July of 2021. He has been instrumental in progressing the Impact Idaho Fund into a powerful new resource to provide patient, low-cost capital to build community resilience. Nate's professional background is in education and non-profit administration, most recently working as the Leader of Institutional Advancement at The Sage School.

"Sun Valley Institute for Resilience has shown over the last 2 years under the leadership of Lexie Praggasits that it is poised to deliver impact and resilience for the greater Wood River Valley with our signature programs and the Impact Idaho Fund. Going forward, we are looking to create a step change in our strategy with the appointment of Nate Twichell as the new strategic leader and Executive Director of SVIR," said Board Co-chair, Jeffrey Hogue.

Board co-chair Nina Tooley added, "Nate is an energized, engaged and motivated leader who will shape the next phase of the institute's impact in our amazing local community and beyond."

Nate will be stepping into the role after current Executive Director, Lexie Praggastis, stepped down due to family matters requiring her attention. Lexie assumed the Executive Director role in

mid-2020, guiding the organization through the pandemic, building on the organization's legacy, and leading the way on the launch of the Impact Idaho Fund.

Institute Founder, Aimée Christensen, said, "Lexie Praggastis took the helm of the Institute in a deeply challenging time and led with grace and expertise, guiding the organization through the pandemic and building the Impact Idaho Fund. She is a beloved, lifelong member of this community and her accessible, thoughtful, and effective leadership of the Institute will be sorely missed."
