Volunteer Shift Information

Neighborhood Science After School volunteers will arrive at library branches at (or before) 3:00pm and will report to the organizing librarian. Volunteers should make sure that activity tables are covered with a green or black tablecloth and that activity signs are visible on each table. If not, volunteers should assist librarians with that task. Additionally, activity providers may need assistance with load-in and set-up, and once activity tables are set, volunteers can pass out “I am a scientist/engineer” buttons to the providers.

Once the event begins, volunteers are welcomed to pass out “I heart science” stickers to participants and assist librarians with any crowd control issues around popular activity stations. Volunteers are also responsible for evaluating event attendees (evaluations can be found in our volunteer bags). This year, PSF staff will attempt a more “kid-friendly” evaluation, and you will have to talk with the children to get their feedback on the events.

Once the event has concluded at 5:30pm, please collect the acrylic sign holders, and assist with any clean-up or load-out. Place the sign holders in the PSF bag (you should have received an extra in your volunteer bag) and return to the librarian. Thank you for volunteering for the Philadelphia Science Festival!
